The 4th and 5th grade Reading state assessments take place on the first two days of this month, followed by the Grade 5 Science FSA on May 3 and May 6, then the 3rd, 4th and 5th grade Math state assessments taking place on May 7 and 8. It's six days in a row of state assessments, and the students are eager to score high on these challenging exams.

After the state testing period, Markham will settle-in for the final weeks of the school year. This is a time when teachers and students prepare for our young learners to move on to new challenges for next year. It's also a time for more fun and diverse learning opportunities.

In fact, during the closing weeks of the school year, several events are planned. These include **Markham's Got Talent**, a special evening showcasing the unique talents of some of our students and teachers, which will take place in the cafeteria on **Thursday evening**, **May 16th**, **beginning at 6:30 p.m.** Parents and community members are urged to come and support our performers.

In addition, field trips to Florida colleges and Sea World, Field Day, moving up ceremonies and other special events are planned as the school year winds to a close. Of course, as always, community members and parents are encouraged to take part in all of these special events.
