What is an internship?

Definition: the position of a student or trainee who works in an organization, sometimes without pay, in order to gain work experience or satisfy requirements for a qualification.

Types of internships:

Paid Internships - Paid internships exist primarily in the private sector or in large organizations that have the money to pay students to learn while they work.

Internships for college credit - Internships for credit require that the experience is strongly related to an academic discipline to be deemed "credit-worthy". The main question is determining the value of the internship experience in a higher education context. This is something you as the internship program creator can research to see if your program aligns with credit criteria. If yes, your program could be a more desirable option for potential candidates.

Summer Internships – Students have less academic requirements and more availability." Summer internships typically run for eight to twelve weeks long and can be full or part-time. These short-term experiences provide a real insight into what it's actually like working in a particular job or career field.

What is an internship? Why participate in one?

Definition: the position of a student or trainee who works in an organization, sometimes without pay, in order to gain work experience or satisfy requirements for a qualification.

Types of internships:

Nonprofit Internships – With no stockholders, shares in the annual profits or losses that are determined by the organization each year, the focus is more on providing a service. As you would expect, interns generally do not get paid when interning at a nonprofit. However, completing an internship in a nonprofit organization provides some very useful skills required by employers when seeking to hire entry-level employees in this field.

Externships – Generally shorter than an internship. Externships provide brief experiential learning opportunities for students, typically consisting of a day to a few weeks. Externships are sometimes referred to as job shadowing, as they allow students to gain insight and knowledge in a career field of interest, by determining whether the job's day-to-day activities and responsibilities are a good fit for their skills and interests.

Service Learning - Service learning requires a combination of meeting specific learning objectives by completing some type of community service work. It is usually structured as a three step process in which students outline their proposed service term and objectives, perform the service work, and then present conclusions based on an analysis of their experiences. Service learning allows students to work in organized service.

How to apply for internships and when to start looking

As far as looking for internships, begin now!

December is the prime time to begin your applications that may be due in the spring for summer internships, however, many internships may be during the year/ scholar based and may require more details/ a longer application timeline.

*summer programs are similar to internships in the sense that you are expanding your knowledge within the career field- some may be used interchangeably

1st: Determine what internship would interest you/ aligns with your career goals (medicine, engineering, etc).

2nd: Determine what internship you would like to complete (ex: summer)

GripTape Challenge

What is it?

- You're completely in charge of deciding what you explore and how you do it.
- Your learning doesn't depend on school, so you can do the Challenge on your own, outside of class.
- You lead your learning, and no more than 1/3 of your time and grant in the Challenge is spent in adult-led experiences like classes, camp, or study abroad programs.
- You have 10 weeks to complete your Challenge.
- You receive a mentor for the 10 weeks

Eligibility Requirement:

- You are between 14 and 19 years old.
- You live or go to school in the US
- You have a passion you want to pursue

Application details:

- Application opens January 1st for the Spring cycle
- Summer cycle opens around May
- Rolling Application
- Powerpoint, essay, videos, etc.
 Examples: Learning a language, starting a business, cosplay, passion project, starting a podeast...
- Fours questions: Why? How? What? What do you want to discover?
- Be the most authentic version of who you are.




College-Specific Scholarships Tool


National Scholarship Search Tool

The "Click here" link will allow you to complete "About Me" information. After inputting your major and academics, you will find an abundance of national scholarship matches based on your profile.




Scholarship Search Tool
