SUBJECT: 21st ANNUAL CUSTOMER SURVEY RESULTS

The 2014-15 Annual Customer Survey was administered in February and March 2015. This year's survey included representation from students, teachers, parents, and school-based non-instructional staff. In addition, the AdvancED ASSIST survey was administered alongside the traditional District survey. Next year, the AdvancED ASSIST survey will be required as part of the District's accreditation process. By administering the AdvancED ASSIST survey in 2014-15, the District and schools were afforded an opportunity to obtain some advanced indication of likely responses. The survey data are now available.

Attached to this memorandum is a one-page overview of findings. A detailed report describing procedures, District-wide data summaries, and question-by-question analysis is also attached. Specific reports for each school are available in the Data Warehouse Reports folders.

2014-15 Annual Survey of Students, Teachers, Parents, and Non-Instructional Staff

The 2014-15 Annual Customer Survey of students, teachers, parents, and non-instructional staff marks a shift in its twenty-one year history. The purpose of the survey remains consistent with prior years—to report on the perceptions of school climate held by students, parents, teachers, and, beginning last year, school-based non-instructional staff. However, this year's survey administration fulfilled an additional task of comparing the traditional District survey with another climate survey produced by AdvancED. AdvancED is a non-profit, non-partisan organization that conducts reviews of schools in order to grant accreditation.

Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) has been accredited since 1962 when it became Florida's first fully accredited school system. Current policy grants accreditation for five years, after which schools must undergo the review process in order to be re-accredited. BCPS is now preparing for reaccreditation in 2016. The AdvancED ASSIST survey, called AdvancED, is a component of the accreditation process, and was administered alongside the District survey in this transition year. The results from both surveys are presented herein with the intention that they will be used to support communication between schools and their communities, assist in school improvement planning, and provide instructional climate measurement.

The *District survey* retains the same survey items as in the 2013-14 administration. The survey was designed to measure perceptions related to the three goals of the District's Three-year Strategic Plan (*High-Quality Instruction, Continuous Improvement*, and *Effective Communication*). In addition, survey questions measured four key components of school climate: *Collaborative Teaching, Instructional Practice, School Leadership*, and *Supportive Environment*.¹ Survey participants were also provided an opportunity to list up to five issues they would like to raise with their school principal and District administration. The District survey was available in four languages (English, Spanish, Portuguese, and Haitian-Creole). Table 1 displays the climate areas surveyed for each of the respondent groups.

Beginning in the 2015-16 school year, AdvancED will require BCPS to administer their survey as part of the accreditation process. As these surveys have never been utilized in BCPS, the District was afforded an opportunity during the present school year to administer them to obtain baseline responses. The AdvancED ASSIST survey was administered to elementary (grades 3 to 5) and secondary (grades 6 to 12) students, parents, and teachers. All groups responded to survey questions related to *Purpose and Direction, Governance and Leadership, Teaching and Assessing for Learning, Resources and Support Systems,* and *Using Results for Continuous Improvement.*²

In addition, participants had an opportunity to provide written feedback. The AdvancED ASSIST surveys were available in English only.

Administering the AdvancED ASSIST survey alongside the traditional District survey afforded the opportunity to (1) obtain feedback from multiple survey instruments, (2) compare the perspectives collected by these two instruments, and (3) obtain a baseline as to the type of responses that schools would obtain when administering the surveys for accreditation during the following school year. To be respectful of the time and effort required on the part of the participants, no individuals were required to complete both the traditional District survey and the AdvancED ASSIST survey. Instead, participants were *randomly assigned* to complete one survey <u>or</u> the other.

To implement this random assignment, the Information and Technology Department (I&T) developed a login and assignment process within Virtual Counselor. Participants signed into Virtual Counselor and selected a link if they were ready to complete the survey. Upon selecting the link, 50% of the participants began the traditional District survey, implemented by I&T, and 50% began the AdvancED ASSIST survey, implemented by AdvancED. The surveys were available for completion between from January 20, 2015, to February 27, 2015.

Participation

How was participation promoted?

Student Assessment & Research (SAR) staff used a number of multi-media methods at the school and District levels in an effort to increase participation. A Parent Survey Action Plan Checklist was created and distributed to school administrators, which included a schedule for schools to follow during the survey administration window, as well as templates and verbiage (in multiple languages) for a variety of methods of communication. Schools were also encouraged to develop other strategies and incentives to further promote parent participation. The action plan included resources to promote parent participation through:

- Notifications and reminder letters
- Newsletter, website, and marquee announcements
- ParentLink messages
- Onsite strategies (e.g., survey stations, promotion during special events, and parent conferences, etc.)
- Networking with parent groups
- Teacher e-mails to parents

SAR staff also established and monitored an Annual Survey CAB conference to distribute information, provide support, and share best practices with principals and their survey administration designees. Staff further promoted participation at the District level through:

- Posting an annual survey link and banner message on the District website
- Posting messages on department websites
- Sending District CAB alerts
- Sending District ParentLink messages
- Submitting press releases
- Posting on social media such as Facebook and Twitter
- Posting notices on web-based local news sites (e.g., Ft. Lauderdale Connex, Aldea Educativa)

- Creating and distributing annual survey flyers and FAQs to schools, departments, District partners, and external agencies
- Conducting presentations (13) to internal and external partners (e.g., Area Advisories, District Advisory Council, Diversity Committee, ESOL Leadership, Gifted Advisory Council, Parent/Community Task Force, PTA, Technology Advisory)

What was the level of participation?




Figure 1. Participation rates for 2014-15.

Figure 1 displays the participation rates by respondent group and school level. A total of 137,442 students, 7,094 teachers, 4,270 non-instructional staff, and 11,148 parents submitted valid surveys, yielding estimated response rates of 82%, 60%, 60%, and 7%, respectively.³

Overall, student participation was higher in 2014-15 relative to the previous year (82%, up from 71% in 2013-14). Teacher participation (60%) was lower than the prior year (66%), and non-instructional staff participation remained the same (60%). The decline registered by teachers may be partially due to technical difficulties experienced by prospective participants when attempting to log into Virtual Counselor. Despite steps to encourage participation, parent participation increased slightly from 2013-14 from 5% to 7%.

Overall Perspectives

Were the surveys reliable?

Reliability is an important psychometric property referring to the degree to which an instrument yields consistent results across items (Lester & Bishop, 2000). To determine reliability of the surveys, we looked at the consistency of scores across items within each scale.

Scales were created in the traditional District survey to summarize perceptions related to the three components of the District's Strategic Plan (*High-Quality Instruction, Continuous Improvement,* and *Effective Communication*) and four components of the school climate (*Collaborative Teaching, Instructional Practice, School Leadership,* and *Supportive Environment*). The number of items comprising each scale ranged from 3 to 16. Questions were presented as five-point Likert-type items with options ranging from (1) *Strongly Disagree* to (5) *Strongly Agree* with a *Don't Know* option as a sixth choice.

As in the prior year, reliability of the survey scales were assessed as Cronbach's Alpha (α) coefficients. The coefficients can range from 0 to 1, with values closer to 1 indicating a higher degree of agreement among items within the scale. Items comprising a common scale should have a strong α coefficient. Coefficients between 0.10 and 0.29 are considered small, between 0.30 and 0.49 moderate, and 0.50 and higher large (Cohen, 1988). Table 3 displays the number of items comprising each scale and α . The Alpha coefficients tended to be in the moderate to high range with only two notable exceptions.

The *Effective Communication* (0.25) and *Collaborative Teaching* (0.08) reliabilities for Teachers decreased substantially from 2013-14 (0.62 and 0.61 respectively). This decrease was due largely to the change in the response characteristics of one item: *My students are capable of meeting the learning standards expected at this school.* This item will be explored in a subsequent section.

The AdvancED ASSIST survey created scales which measured *Purpose and Direction, Governance and Leadership, Teaching and Assessing for Learning, Resources and Support Systems,* and *Using Results for Continuous Improvement*. Questions for each scale were presented under its respective headings in order to provide respondents with a context from which to conceptualize the survey items. The scales were consistent for all groups, however, the elementary students had a narrower range of responses ("I don't agree", "I'm not sure", "I agree", all accompanied by emoticons) than

did the secondary students, parents, and teachers ("Strongly disagree", "Disagree", "Neutral", "Agree", "Strongly Agree", and "Not Applicable"). Table 4 displays the number of items comprising each scale and α . With the exception of the elementary student survey, the Alpha coefficients for the AdvanceD ASSIST surveys were all high.

Do the perspectives reported on the traditional District survey and the AdvancED ASSIST survey agree?

The District and AdvancED ASSIST surveys both ask questions regarding important aspects of the school environment. Unfortunately, they use different scales of measurement, making a direct comparison of the two surveys difficult. However, we can examine the degree to which the different scales for both surveys relate to each other to get an overall sense of how well the surveys agree. To accomplish this, we looked at the correlations between the seven District and five AdvancED ASSIST survey scales. A correlation of 1.0 would be a perfect correlation, meaning the two surveys agree exactly. Any number greater than zero indicates a positive association, with correlations closer to one being higher. Correlations between the District and AdvancED ASSIST surveys were mostly moderate.⁴ For elementary students, the average correlation was 0.42 (correlations ranged between -0.05 to 0.69), for secondary students 0.70 (ranging from 0.31 to 0.86), for teachers 0.46 (ranging from 0.33 to 0.60), and for parents 0.31 (0.19 to 0.44). See Appendix A for the detailed summary of correlations.

What are the perceptions reported by the Students, Parents, Teachers, and Non-Instructional Staff?

Both the traditional District and the AdvancED ASSIST surveys showed generally positive ratings across all groups. First, we looked at the District survey results. The traditional District survey was administered using the same questions as in the previous year administration, allowing for a comparison of the results (Table 5 and Figure 2). Overall, scale scores tended to be slightly more positive than last year across the board. After averaging all of the scale scores, parents and non-instructional staff had the highest overall rating at 4.2, followed by students at 4.1, and teachers at 3.9. Students and non-instructional staff both increased by 0.2 points, and teachers and parents

both increased by 0.1. There were only two cases in which scale scores went down: collaborative teaching for teachers (-0.1) and instructional practice for parents (-0.4).



Figure 2 is a graphical representation of Table 6, showing overall average scale scores for each of the groups taking the District survey in both 2013-14 and 2014-15. The bars on the graph illustrate the average score for all of the respondents in each of the groups⁵, regardless of school level⁶, and the black error bars towards the right of the graph represent one standard deviation to provide an indication of the variability of the scores.

⁵ For the District survey, respondents needed to have answered at least 10 questions (5 for non-instructional staff) to be included in the scale scores.




Figure 3. AdvancED ASSIST Survey, Average Scale Scores by Group, 2014-15

For respondent groups answering the AdvancED ASSIST survey results were again positive with most groups averaging close to a 4, corresponding with "Agree" (Figure 3). However, secondary students averaged closer to a 3.5, which is half-way between "neither agree nor disagree" and "agree."

Highlights of Selected Items from the District Survey

The scales summarized in the previous sections provide a high-level index of the perceptions reported by students, teachers, parents, and non-instructional staff. These indices are useful for gaining a broad understanding of the perceptions of the climate in BCPS schools. This section delves further into the perceptions of stakeholders by examining specific items. We start by looking at how the different groups report feeling about their school's environment overall, and then move to items that have either substantially changed since last year, or remain a topic of elevated importance. A complete list of responses is included in the attachments, with summaries provided overall and by school level for each respondent group.

Overall Rating

As an overall assessment, all respondents were asked to rate their school's environment on a five-point scale from Poor to Excellent. Figure 4⁷ shows a comparison between 2014 and 2015 for students, teachers, and non-instructional staff⁸.




Figure 4. How do you rate your school's environment overall?

Students this year remained at approximately half (51%) feeling their school's environment is "good" or "excellent." However, they were more likely to rate their school as "good" rather than "excellent" compared to last year. Teachers rated their school's environment more favorably this year, with fewer teachers rating their school's environment as "fair" or "poor," and more rating it as "good." Non-instructional staff showed the highest increase in satisfaction with their school's environment, exhibiting with an eight percentage point increase in "excellent," a nine percentage point increase in "good," and corresponding decreases in the other categories.

Figures 5A – 5C display the responses from students, teachers, and non-instructional staff by school level for the current year disaggregated by school level.




Figure 5A. Students: How do you rate your school's environment overall?

Students. Elementary students rated their schools the most favorable; with 76% giving a rating of "good" or "excellent" (Figure 5A). Middle school students provided the next highest ratings of "good" or "excellent" (41%), followed by high school students (40%), and Centers (33%).




Figure 5B. Teachers: How do you rate your school's environment overall?

Teachers. Elementary and high school teachers had the most favorable impressions with 68% each giving a rating of "excellent" or "good" (Figure 5B). Middle school teachers had the next highest rating of "excellent" or "good" at 59%, followed by Centers at 53%.




Figure 5C. Non-Instructional Staff: How do you rate your school's environment overall?

Non-Instructional. At each level except for centers, 75% or more non-instructional staff gave their schools ratings of either "excellent" or "good" (Figure 5C). Fifty-nine percent of non-instructional center staff gave the highest two ratings.

Changes in Responses from 2013-14




Figure 6. Teachers: "My students are capable of meeting the learning standards expected at this school."

Most responses in this year's survey were similar to last year's, with an overall trend towards more positive ratings. There was, however, one question which deviated from last year. That question, on the teacher survey, was "My students are capable of meeting the learning standards expected at this school." In 2013-14, 73% of teachers either agreed or strongly agreed. This year, 43% of teachers agreed or strongly agreed with this statement (Figure 6). The corresponding increase in the percentage of teachers neither agreeing nor disagreeing suggests that teachers have an uncertainty related to the new Florida Standards. They may be unsure if their students can meet the new standards, unclear about the contents of the standards, or uncertain as to how to teach the standards. While these data reveal an uncertainty among teachers in this area, they do not clarify the reason behind it.

Although not as dramatic a shift as the question above, there was also a change in the percent of teachers who believe they have enough time to teach all of their students the required curriculum.




Figure 7. Teachers: "I have enough time to teach all of my students all of the required curriculum."

In 2013-14, 40% of teachers either agreed or strongly agreed that they had enough time to teach the required curriculum compared to 32% in 2014-15. This finding further supports that teachers feel challenged by the instructional changes associated with the implementation of the new standards.

How well are students engaged in the topics being taught?






Figure 8. Students reporting interest in what is taught in school, 2013-14 and 2014-15.

Student engagement in learning is essential to academic success. Students rated their interest in what is being taught in three core subject areas (Figure 8)⁹. A consistent pattern was found for each subject: interest waned as students got older with elementary students registering the highest level of interest, followed by a decline in interest in middle school students, and a further decline in high school students. The most dramatic difference occurred in mathematics, with interest decreasing from 83% of elementary students professing interest to 54% of high school students. This is the same pattern seen in last year's survey.

Students in all levels except for elementary rated the highest level of interest in science. Interest in science increased slightly from the prior year at the middle school (72% to 77%), high school (62% to 64%), and center level (68% to 71%).

How challenging is the coursework to students?

In addition to interest, lessons and assignments need to be appropriately challenging. Too easy and students lose interest, too difficult and students become frustrated. Students rated the level of difficulty of the classes they are taking in each of the same three core areas. Ratings were made on a five-point scale from "too easy" to "too difficult" with "just right" denoting the midpoint.

In comparing students overall (regardless of level) to last year, students were more likely to say that the difficulty level of all three subject areas was just right (Figure 9). However, the students who did not rate the difficulty level as being just right were more likely to say that the work was more difficult than it was last year. In every subject, there was a decrease in the percent of students who felt the difficulty level was easy, and an increase in the percent of students who felt the work was difficult.





Across all grade levels, 58% to 62% of students felt the difficulty level was just right for English/Language Arts and 53% to 59% felt the difficulty level was just right for Science. For math, a smaller percent (38% to 45%) felt the difficulty level was just right. More students also rated math as difficult than any other subject – with high school students and center students being more likely to rate math as difficult (47% and 48%, respectively) than just right (41% and 38%). A greater proportion of middle school students also rated math as difficult (40%) than they did other subject areas. Elementary students, however, were more likely to give math a rating of easy (34%) than difficult (22%). This overall pattern mirrors that of last year's survey, and once again suggests that the relative level of rigor is not consistent across school levels.

Figure 10A. Students: Difficulty of Language Arts




Figure 10B. Students: Difficulty of Math






Figure 10C. Students: Difficulty of Science



How do teachers perceive the learning expectations?

Teachers provided their perspectives of the learning expectations for the academic subject areas that they teach (Figure 11, below). In many subject areas, approximately 20% of students rated core subjects as easy, compared to only 1% to 4% of teachers reporting that learning expectations were easy. While the majority of teachers rated learning expectations as just right (58% overall), a large percent of teachers felt that learning expectations were difficult (40% overall).

Last year, between 31% and 35% of teachers rated learning expectations as being difficult depending on the academic area. This increased perception of difficulty in learning expectations may be related to the necessity to teach new standards as well as the anticipation of the new assessments.

How do parents perceive the amount of homework their children receive?






Figure 12A. Parents: How do you rate the amount of homework assigned to your child for Langauge Arts?

Parents were asked to rate the amount of homework their children receive. Results are summarized in Figure 12A through 12D. While most parents felt the amount of homework their children received was just right, parents were more likely to say their children had no or too little homework assigned in science and social studies than in English/Language Arts or mathematics. Center parents were less likely to feel that the amount of homework their children were receiving was just right, and more likely to feel they were receiving no or too little homework, regardless of the subject area. Elementary school parents reported similar ratings to middle and high school parents for English/Language Arts and mathematics but almost twice as many reported no or too little homework being assigned in the areas of science and social studies.




Figure 12C. Parents: How do you rate the amount of homework assigned to your child in Science?

Bullying

A safe environment is critical to learning. When students are calm, they are able to process information at a deeper level (The Hawn Foundation, 2011). This higher level thinking is not only crucial to academic achievement, it is also essential for constructive behaviors and positive social interactions.

One of the primary threats to a feeling of safety in schools is bullying. Bullying in Broward County Public Schools is defined as "systematically and chronically inflicting physical hurt or psychological distress on one or more students or employees" (Broward Schools, 2015). The Department of Diversity, Prevention, and Intervention provides resources for schools to administer bullying-prevention curriculum to students at all grade levels including the *ABC's of Bullying Prevention* book which contains three lessons for each grade-level. The District survey included a question aimed at gauging the degree to which these or other resources were used to educate students about bullying.

Students were asked to rate the statement, "A teacher or another adult at school told our class about bullying this school year." Overall, 68% of students either agreed or strongly agreed with this statement (71% agreed or strongly agreed in last year's survey). Elementary students were more likely to agree or strongly agree with this statement (84%), followed by middle school students (75%), center students (52%) and high school students (51%).




Figure 13. Students Reporting being Bullied Comparison between 2014 and 2015

Students were asked if they have been bullied this year (I have been bullied at school or online by classmates this year). The highest levels of bullying were reported by elementary students, the lowest by high school students, with middle and center students falling in between the two. In comparing responses with last year's, each of the groups of students reported lower levels of bullying (Figure 13, below). These results are consistent with the idea that bullying prevention initiatives may be having a positive impact.

Parents, teachers, and non-Instructional staff were also asked questions about bullying. Parents were asked "Have you reported an incident of bullying or cyberbullying this year?", and teachers and non-instructional staff were asked, "Has a student reported an incident of bullying or cyberbullying to you this year?"




Figure 14. Reported Bullying: Teachers, Parents, and Non-Instructional Staff

The same questions were asked last year, allowing for a comparison of the responses (Figure 14). As with students, the rate at which parents, teachers, and non-Instructional staff said they reported an incident of bullying this year decreased at all levels with two exceptions; parents and non-instructional staff both reported an increase at the center schools.




Figure 15. Adult's Impact on Bullying

A separate item assessed perceptions concerning the impact of adult intervention in bullying at school (Figure 15). Students who said they had been bullied reported that the bullying stopped after telling an adult between 33% (high school and centers) and 50% (elementary school) of the time. In contrast, most teachers (69% to 87%) believed that the bullying stopped after they addressed it. These responses appear to suggest that teachers felt that their intervention was more effective in stopping bullying than students did. It may be that a student who did not feel that the teacher's intervention was helpful did not report subsequent incidents of bullying. However, it is also possible that teachers addressed multiple bullying incidents and were more likely to report on their successes.

What are some general themes respondents mentioned in their written responses?

Written Feedback

Students, parents, teachers, and non-instructional staff were given the opportunity to provide written comments. On the traditional District survey, the participants could describe up to five topics that they would like to bring to the attention of their school's principal and the Superintendent. The AdvancED version of the survey included three separate questions: "What do you like best about our school?", "What do you like least about our school?" and "What is one suggestion you would like to offer to improve our school?" The following is a high-level summary of the responses to the traditional District survey. All written responses—without participant identifying information—are provided directly to each school's principal for review.

What's on your students' mind?




Figure 16. Student Written Feedback Summary

A total of 45,113 (64%) of the students responding to the traditional District survey provided written feedback. Their responses were categorized using text analytics software (SPSS Text Analytics for Surveys). The top 10 major themes emerging from these comments are summarized in Figure 16.

The most commonly discussed topic was school meals with 28% of students providing such comments. Many of these comments pertained to food choices, serving size, amount of time allotted for lunch, and the quality of the food. The second most commonly addressed topic concerned the learning environment. This broad category included such issues as how much students feel they are learning in specific classes, the perceived relevance of what they are learning, and methods used for instruction. This category was closely related to one concerning teachers, which addressed such issues as student-teacher relations and teaching methods as well as a broad range of comments about specific teachers and their courses. Students also took the opportunity to provide comments about themselves and their peers. They commented on student behaviors, motivation, stress, and opportunities that are either afforded to themselves or would like to see available at school.




Figure 17. Parent Written Feedback Summary

What's on our parents' mind? A total of 2,577 (45%) of the participating parents provided written comments on the traditional District survey. Comments about academics, particularly with regard

to the curriculum, education standards, and expectations were most commonly addressed with 22% of parents commenting in this area (Figure 17). Parents were also concerned about the environment within the school that their children attend. This is reflected in comments about student behaviors and interactions with staff, as well as comments about the school facilities, particularly with regard to maintenance, safety, and equipment. Parents expressed a desire for improved or more frequent communications with their schools, and are seeking more opportunities for family involvement—while asserting constraints on family time and schedules.




Figure 18. Teacher Written Feedback Summary

What is on our teachers' mind? Fifty-nine percent (1,943) of the participating teachers provided written comments on the District survey. Figure 18 shows the top most discussed topics mentioned by teachers. Not surprisingly, academics topped the list with 36% of the teachers who provided comments mentioning issues related to this area. "Academics" is a very broad category covering issues such as availability and quality of instructional materials, student's academic preparation, perceptions of various academic programs such as STEM, and innovative reading and math programs. Comments predominately concerning students were also provided by many teachers, particularly with regard to understanding and addressing student needs, motivation, and preparation for their classes. Technology was addressed by 22% of the teachers with many comments pertaining to the availability, reliability, and age of computers. Following closely to technology, the teachers discussed issues pertaining to the faculty such as morale, working

conditions, and professional standards of practice. Human resource issues, such as career and professional development and support staffing, were also prevalent in the teachers' comments.

What is on our non-instructional staffs' mind? One-third (1,433; 32%) of the participating non-instructional staff provided written comments on the District survey. In contrast to the other participant groups, comments tended to be more evenly distributed across categories. Approximately 12% of the non-instructional staff provided comments on their school's policies and culture. Approximately the same proportion provided a range of comments concerning their observations and interactions with students. About 10% of the respondents provided comments related to human resources, including career development, benefits, and progression opportunities. A nearly equal proportion commented on staffing, including sufficiency of staffing to provide the needed support, supervision, and morale.




Figure 19. Non-Instructional Staff Written Feedback Summary

What are the limitations of the survey?

There were a number of technical issues related to the survey administration that impacted data collection. First, participants could access and complete the surveys multiple times. In the event that an individual completed the District survey more than once, only the most recent record was retained. As the AdvancED ASSIST survey was completed outside of the BCPS infrastructure, there was no way to identify multiple completions or to limit the data to a single record per respondent. Thus, it is possible that some respondents may be represented more than once.

Second, the AdvancED ASSIST surveys were only offered in English. Any participants indicating that they wanted to complete the survey in a language other than English were automatically directed to the traditional District survey. Thus, the 50%-50% random assignment was only accomplished for individuals indicating that they wished to complete the survey in English.

Third, there were a number of technical issues and programming errors. A number of staff members reported the freezing of Virtual Counselor when attempting to log on, which may have deterred participation. In addition, coding errors prevented the accurate recording of responses for some questions on the traditional District surveys. The problematic questions have been discarded from the data analysis.

Finally, technical issues prevented the survey from being launched on the scheduled launch date of January 5, which likely had a significant negative impact on participation rates as schools geared up to administer the survey during this time period but were unable to do so.

Next Steps

This report highlights the responses of students, teachers, parents, and non-instructional staff to the 2014-15 Annual Customer Survey and AdvancED ASSIST Survey. District and school level summaries for each of the constituent groups taking the survey¹¹ are attached to this report for all closed-ended items. Reports appear separately for the District survey and the AdvancED ASSIST survey. Individual school level reports of the closed-ended responses have been prepared and are available at http://www.broward.k12.fl.us/sar/.

School administrators are encouraged to review the specific data for their schools in conjunction with the summarized data for their school level to identify areas that may need additional attention and investigation. These data may serve as a foundation to enhance communication with staff, parents, and students while addressing school needs. At the District level, the Office of School Performance & Accountability directors may find this information useful for assisting schools to improve their instructional climates and provide support for school improvement efforts.
