## **School Hours**

Our school day starts at 8:00 A.M. and ends at 2:00 P.M. Please have your children arrive to school prior to 7:55 A.M. This will ensure they are in their seats by 8:00 A.M. and ready to learn. All dismissal changes must be called into the front office by 1:30 P.M. No early dismissal after 1:30 P.M. We offer morning care at 6:45 A.M. and we start serving breakfast as early as 7:30 A.M. Reminder - Per Fla. State Statute Section 1003.31 (2): Please do not drop off students prior to 7:30 A.M., as there is no supervision.

#### **Unified Dress Code**

Ramblewood Elementary has a unified dress code. Student adherence to our dress code is important in helping us identify those that belong on campus. If you would like to opt out of the unified dress code, please stop by the office to sign the waiver.

#### **Arrival/Dismissal**

## **Arrival Procedures:**

- According to their grade level, students will enter the school through the designated double doors at the front entrance of the building or the west side. They will wait inside in their designated areas.
- All other side doors, back doors and gates are locked and not available for entry.
- Please follow the traffic flow and move forward until cars have stopped.
- **PreK students** will be dropped off and picked up at the designated PreK area (by west bike rack).

## **Dismissal Procedures:**

- East Walkers: will be at their designated area by the front bike rack. Parents picking up east walkers will need to show school generated dismissal tag. Please wait in one orderly line.
- West Walkers: will be at their designated area behind the west bike rack. Parents picking up west walkers will need to show school generated dismissal tag. Please wait in one orderly line.
- Car pick-up: will continue on the west side, however, school generated dismissal tag <u>must</u> be displayed at all times for student safety on the dashboard or visor. If dismissal tag is not <u>visible</u>, the driver will be <u>required</u> to park and go to the front office to show I.D.
- If your family requires additional I.D. signs or cards, please contact the school.

## **Multisensory Strategies to Support Reading**

Multisensory strategies integrate visual, auditory, tactile (touch), and kinesthetic (movement) learning to assist students with understanding new information, learning ways to remember the information, and having more ways to recall it later on. At times, taste may also be used. These different methods of learning stimulate different parts of the brain. This helps students discover their unique learning style and which techniques work best for their learning. Multisensory strategies are effective for all learners and help break down barriers to learning. Here are a few multisensory strategies for each different method of learning below.

#### Visual

- Use painting, posters, video, creative visual design elements, and visual aids.
- Play tic-tac-toe with words.

#### Auditory

- Use music, singing, rhymes, audio tones, lyrics, clapping, and conversations.
- Integrate rhyming into your daily routines.
- Read poetry and rhyming books.

## Tactile (touch)

- Use letter tiles, coins, dominoes, sand, raised line paper, textures, and finger paints.
- Spell and stamps words with/in playdough.
- Use sandpaper, chalk, and Legos to create letters/words.

## Ways to Report Threats

Be a Broward Buddy, Report a Tip! Call 911 immediately in an emergency. If you have a NON-Emergency Safety or Security concern, please report it through any of our available tip reporting tools. You can report a tip 24 hours a day, seven days a week by calling 754-321-3500, using the Anonymous Tip Submission Box on the Broward Schools website, sending an email to SecurityTips@browardschools.com, accessing FortifyFL or accessing the SaferWatch App on your phone or mobile device.

By sharing tips to report threats, harassing behaviors, or illegal activity, you can help Broward Schools identify at-risk individuals before they may cause harm to themselves or others. When reporting a tip please provide as much information as possible, including the location, date, and time. The more information that is provided, the better District staff can respond to concerns. It takes all of us to keep our schools and communities safe.

Thank you for doing your part. Together we can continue to make a difference.

#### Attendance

Florida Statute 1003.21 states that all children between the ages of 6 to 16 are required to attend school regularly during the entire school year. Statute 1003.24 states that parents are responsible for the school attendance of their children. Parents, if your child is going to be absent, please call the attendance hotline (754) 322-8152 to report the absence. Parents are responsible for their child's regular attendance. To report an absence, visit our website under CONTACT, then select REPORT AN ABSENCE to submit an electronic form, call the attendance hotline, or deliver a note to our staff. Our goal is to have ALL students that are able to attend more than 95% of school days. Students that are absent 5% or more days may require parental interventions from school staff. Truancy notifications may lead to more severe penalties. Absences impact the teaching and learning for all students in the classroom. If your child must be absent for an excusable reason, please report the absence within 24 hrs. Our attendance clerk will update all absences that are reported and meet one of the reasons in the attendance policy.

## **Emergency Preparedness**

Teaching children what to do in the event of different types of emergencies has always been embedded in your child's instruction. We conduct fire drills monthly and tornado drills two times a year. The district mandates that we conduct "lockdown" drills every month. In the event of an actual emergency, Ramblewood Elementary will communicate with the school community as soon as feasibly possible using ParentLink System. To ensure that you can receive this timely communication, please keep your contact information up to date with the front office of the school.
