September 4, 2019, Regular School Board Meeting K-2 Special Revenue Grants Fund Amendment #3 - Final As of June 30, 2019 Executive Summary

Special Revenue Grants Fund Amendment is submitted to the School Board pursuant to State Board Administrative Rule 6A-1.006. This Amendment is for the purpose of updating the Broward County School District Budget for estimated revenues and appropriation changes in the Special Revenue Grants Fund.

This amendment incorporates several important changes:

- 1. Title I received additional funds from Florida Department of Education to provide stipend payments for middle school Summer camp teachers, supplemental instructional materials, stipend payments for Teachers delivering tutorial services and parental engagement family literacy kits.
- 2. Title II received additional funds from Florida Department of Education to provide stipend payments to teachers for face-to-face professional development to increase skills that influence academic achievement.
- 3. Florida Department of Education approved realignment of PD funds within the Title IV grant to pay stipends for Positive Behavior Reinforcement, retention and recruitment of teachers, stipends for Equity Liaisons, substitutes to cover teacher's professional development and pay stipends to Assistant Principals for courageous conversations on race and anti-bullying training.
- 4. The Immediate Aid to Restart School Operations funds received from Florida Department of Education assisted the District with expenses related to restarting school operations after the impact of Hurricane Irma that were not covered by FEMA. Funds assisted with renovations due to wind, water intrusion electrical surge, replacement of damaged instructional materials and removal of debris. Funds also provided reimbursement to 47 Charter Schools and 135 Private Schools that sustained damages.
