

Benefits of the AP Program

AP provides students the opportunity to take university- level classes while still in high school.

AP courses develop college level academic skills by digging deeper into subjects, requiring students to hone their time management and study skills while tapping into their creativity and problem-solving skills.

College credit is awarded if the student passes the AP exam with a 3 or higher.

AP credits are accepted internationally. Always check with potential colleges prior to taking classes.

AP courses stand out in the college admission process because they demonstrate academic rigor.

AP Scholar Granted to students who receive scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams. So students must take and pass any three AP courses.

AP Seminar and Research Certificate is granted to students who earn scores of 3 or higher in both AP Seminar and AP Research.

AP Capstone Diploma is awarded to student who earn scores of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP research and four additional AP exams of their choosing.

AP Offers additional quality points in the weighted GPA

Passing score on AP US History or AP Government exam may be used to meet the new Civics graduation requirement.

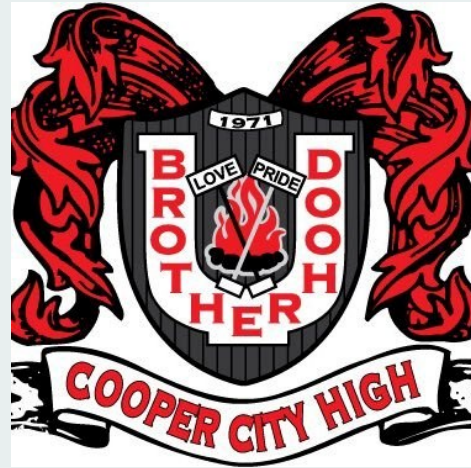

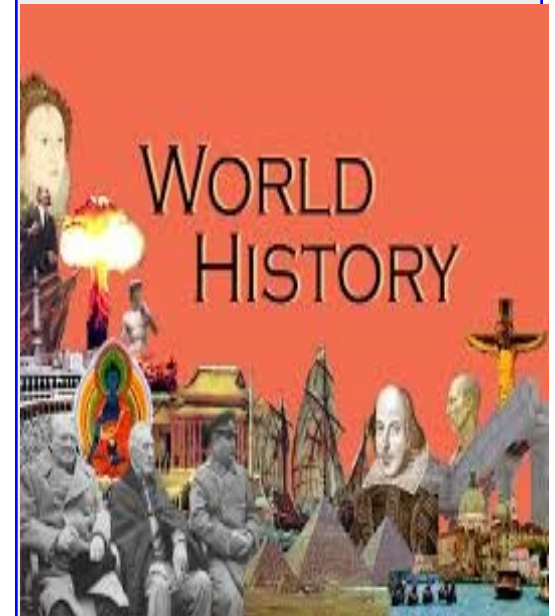

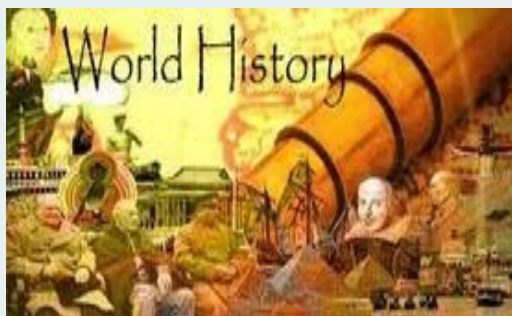
AP Information Night

Students develop and use the same skills and methods employed by historians: analyzing primary and secondary sources; developing historical arguments; making historical connections and utilizing reasoning about comparison, causation, and continuity and change.
