ILLUSTRATIVE: Components of an elementary school schedule

Standard Schedule – Grades K-1

Teacher Planning

Circle Time/Whole Group:

- Students log in to their canvas Homeroom and click on their Whole Group icon for Teams Mtg.
- Mindfulness activity/SEL/Daily Discussion opener (type/video response to a question) – 10 minutes
- Calendar Time – 5 minutes



Whole Group Literacy:

- Interactive Read Aloud/Shared Reading/Weekly Poem
- Brain Break before next whole group activity with music and movement

Whole Group Literacy:

- Explicit & Systematic Instruction in Phonics/Word Work

Small Group:

- Teacher meets with 2-3 small reading groups (about 15-20 minutes each) use TEAM channels for small group while others stay signed in.
- Students watch and participate in pre-recorded lessons and are working in center-like activities. See breakdown of time and menu of examples.



Break

Writing:

- Writing mini-lesson (may be related to read aloud)

Assigned Independent Writing:

- Students write independently.
- Teacher can meet with children or pull smaller groups to share writing in afternoon (students remove headphones to work in a quiet environment, teacher displays a timer to keep students aware of time)



Whole Group Math:

- Lesson w/manipulatives

Small Group Math/Independent Activities

- Personal Math Trainer (PMT) & Small Group math with manipulatives
- Additional centers may include: iReady, Imagine Math, Reflex, etc for 20 minutes (if applicable)



Whole Group Social Studies/Science

- Embed as much into the Literacy Block

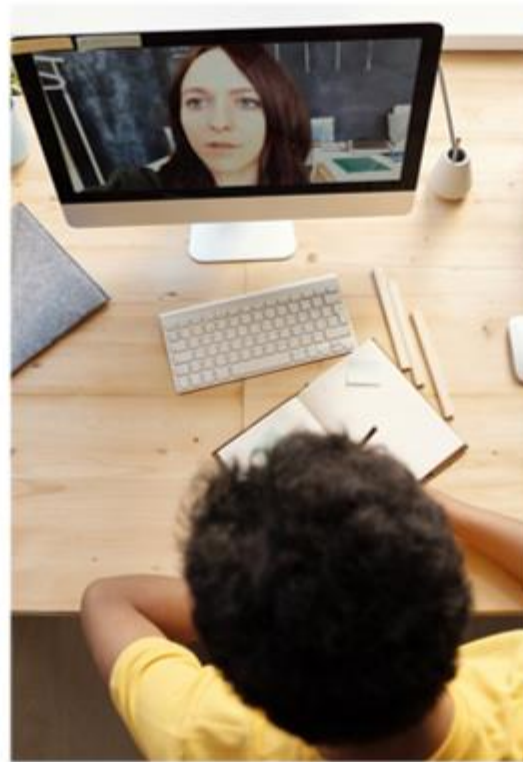

Download the Teams Desktop App Onto a Computer

Step 1: Log into the Clever SSO Launchpad

Step 2: Select the Teams icon.

Step 3: Once Teams loads, look at the top right for the profile icon. This could be initials or an image.

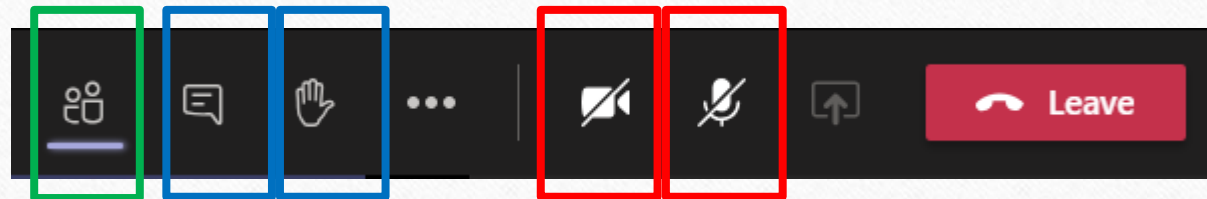

Why am I Having Issues with Teams?

- Make sure that you have logged in with the Teams Desktop Application through the Clever Single Sign On Launch Pad. This will provide you more capabilities than joining by using a web browser. Proper instructions are on the next slide.
- If you're having problems with your webcam or microphone, begin by ensuring that your hardware is plugged in correctly. Next, ensure that during a meeting, your microphone and webcam are enabled. (Highlighted in red below). You **do not** want to see the bar across the video or microphone image.



- How do I get my teacher's attention? Raise your hand or put a message in the chat (highlighted in blue above)
- Why am I coming in as a guest when I join my teacher's Team web conference? You have not logged in using the Clever Single Sign On and clicking on the Teams icon.
- To make sure that you always see your teacher on the screen, you can PIN your teacher. Go to the participant icon (highlighted in green above) and click on the three dots to the right of your teacher's name and then click on PIN.

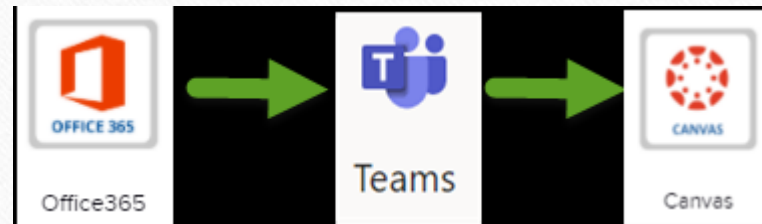
Avoiding Teams Meeting Interruptions

Students should follow these steps, in order, when joining eLearning classrooms in Microsoft Teams:

- (1) Log into sso.browardschools.com
- (2) Select Office 365 from the Clever Launchpad
- (3) Select Teams from the Office 365 page
- (4) Go to the Clever Launchpad and choose Canvas
- (5) Click on the Teams meeting link within the Canvas course

If you have the Teams Desktop app downloaded on your computer, choose to open the desktop app (Preferred). If not, you can continue using the web browser until you download the app.

This will place students into a lobby until the teacher allows them into the eLearning classroom. It will also correctly identify the student as part of the organization and not as a guest.





Web Conferencing Netiquette

Students need to follow proper web conferencing netiquette and display the proper code of conduct and decorum in a virtual meeting. To help you participate well in your class web conference follow these simple virtual meeting netiquette rules and tips:

1. Leave the keyboard alone...
2. Dress appropriately...
3. Be aware of your surroundings...
4. Mute your microphone when you are not talking...
5. Speak up, but do not shout...
6. No food allowed...
6. Stay seated and stay present...
7. Find a quiet location with no or minimal background noise...
9. Turn off all sounds on your phone...
10. Parents should not interrupt meetings...
11. Do not record or upload any portion of any web conference ...

What is Canvas?

Canvas is a Learning Management System, or LMS, and is often described as, "a way to simplify teaching and learning by connecting all the digital tools teachers and students use in one easy place".

With Canvas, students can:

- receive course announcements
- manage upcoming assignments for all courses in one calendar
- submit assignments
- take quizzes
- receive feedback about course work
- communicate with teachers (and other students)
- and much, much more!

Students can access Canvas through their [Single-Sign-On Clever Launch Pad](#), but teachers need to publish courses and content before students can participate and interact with them.

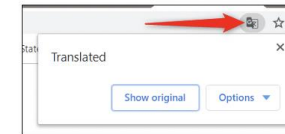
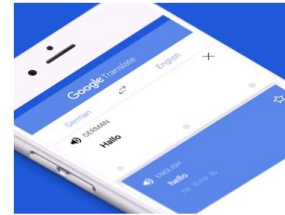

5 REMOTE LEARNING TIPS FOR PARENTS

#4OCF

- Build a Routine.** Try to use the same quiet spot each day. Try to be consistent in time and structure.
- Don't Worry About Finishing Everything.** Learning at home will look different than learning at school. Don't expect that students will finish everything. Don't think you have to.
- Pace Yourself.** Let students work at their own pace. And let them work at **YOUR** pace. Don't try to accomplish everything in one day. Give yourselves the gift of time!
- Take a Break.** When necessary, stop. Don't allow a learning session to turn into a struggle. Let your student take a break if needed. Or take a break if you need it!
- Enjoy THIS time TOGETHER!** This time is unique in history. You didn't plan on being home with your child, make the most of it. Go for a walk. Bake a cake. Take a bike ride. Enjoy the time TOGETHER!

What Parents Can Do HELPING STUDENTS LEARN DURING COVID-19 SCHOOL CLOSURE

1.) A QUIET PLACE

Set up a space that is separate from your family life and area and allows for quiet



2.) TECHNOLOGY

Make sure students have internet and internet-ready devices (see www.mvwsd.org/coronavirus for help)

3.) CHECK IN

Check on progress and remind students to keep working and stay on schedule (Helpful hint: Set cell phone reminders in 30 min increments and ask kids what they're working on)



4.) TAKE BREAKS

Make sure students are taking breaks from technology - and parents, too! Strrreeeeetch

5.) DRESS FOR SUCCESS

Ensure students are dressed appropriately and background distractions are limited while students are participating in video conferencing



6.) YOU-CAN-DO ATTITUDE

Encourage students to keep working when feeling unsuccessful. Encourage and praise students for staying engaged

7.) KEEP IT PRIVATE

To protect students' and teachers' privacy, don't screenshot/record classes' online images and share them on public platforms, like social media (per Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act, and California Education Code Section 51512)
