- ★ Assume your social media usage is **visible to the world and can be considered cyberbullying.**

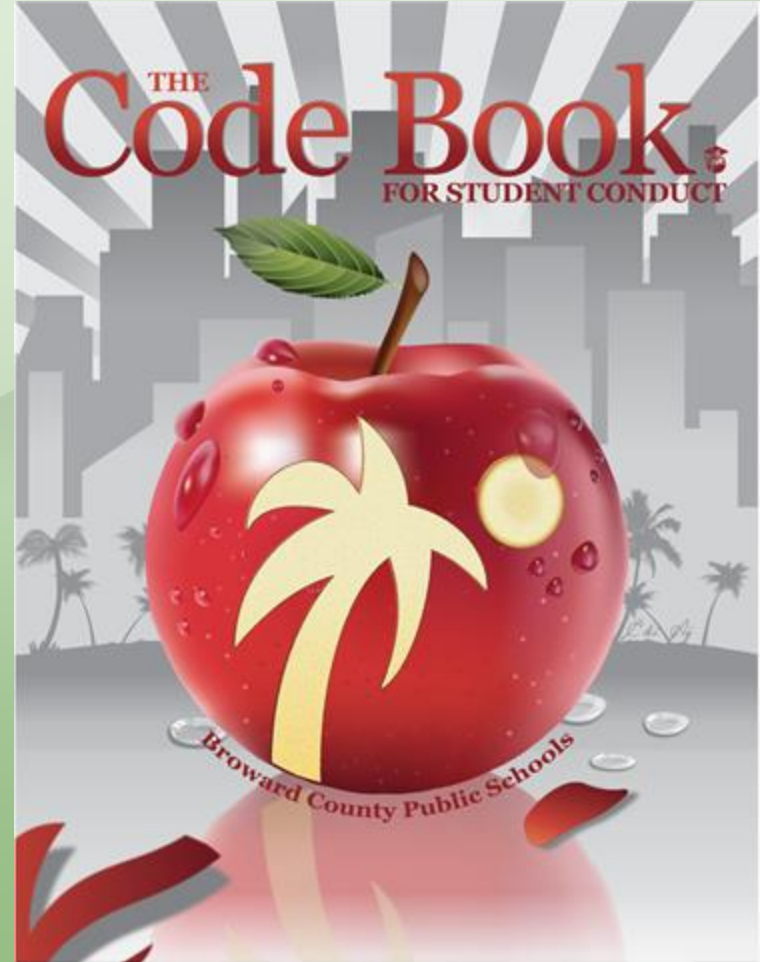
Social MEdia

- ★ Kaplan Test Prep found that two-thirds of colleges say it's "fair game" for them to **review applicants' social media** profiles to help them decide who gets in.
- ★ "70% of employers are **snooping candidates' social media** profiles" according to a CareerBuilder article by Lauren Salam – June 15, 2017.
- ★ Florida State University **denied acceptance to a student** for an inappropriate snapchat sent directly to FSU's Snapchat account.

Bullying

Bullying is the intentional, repeated, hurtful action against someone who has less power.

- ★ R - Repeated
- ★ I - Imbalance of Power
- ★ P - Purposeful

Code of Conduct

cyberBullying

Cyberbullying is bullying through the use of digital technologies, including social media. It includes:

- ★ Stalking
- ★ Intimidation
- ★ Sexting
- ★ Religious or Racial Harassment
- ★ Public or Private Humiliation

Code of Conduct

Respect for person, property, & privacy

Behave in a way that **respects the rights of all**.

We all deserve to feel **safe and respected**.

It is important to know that **video recording is not permitted by Florida law** (video voyeurism) in areas where there is an expectation of privacy.

Code of Conduct

Offences leading to possible suspension or expulsion

DRUG AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE INFRACTIONS

Use, possession, and/or being under the influence of mood-altering substances

Use/Possession of unauthorized substances

Possession of unauthorized prescription medications

Be under the influence of unauthorized substances

Sale, attempted sale, and/or transmittal of drugs or mood-altering substances

Sale, attempted sale, and/or transmittal of alcohol or alcoholic beverages

MOOD-ALTERING SUBSTANCES:

Being under the influence of Marijuana, or over-the-counter medication taken in excess of the prescribed amount

Code of Conduct

Offences leading to possible suspension or expulsion

OTHER INFRACTIONS

Repeatedly commit serious breaches of conduct

Commit an assault

Commit a battery

Commit or threaten to commit vandalism

Commit any act on or off campus that substantially disrupts orderly conduct of school or activities

Commit Grand Theft, including motor vehicle theft

Code of Conduct

Offences leading to possible suspension or expulsion

OTHER INFRACTIONS
Commit an act of hazing
Commit a physical attack/fighting
Commits a sexual offenses
Possess and/or display or transmit a Class B weapon
Use of laser pens/pointers and other laser devices that could potentially harm or injure another individual

Code of Conduct

Offences leading to possible suspension or expulsion

OTHER INFRACTIONS

Make an internet/electronic transmission of a threat to do harm to person(s) on school grounds, or to school property, that result in a substantial disruption to the school climate

Conduct, recruit, or participate on campus in a formal or informal gang activity

Transmit or distribute inappropriate images that violate the rights of other individuals

Commit other criminal actions

Use the school district's technology and/or software for any unauthorized purpose

Code of Conduct

Offences leading to mandatory suspension or expulsion

Bringing a firearm or weapon to school or any school sponsored activity

Making threats or false reporting involving school or school's personnel's property, school transportation, or a school-sponsored activity

Threats to throw, project, place or discharge destructive devices with intent to do bodily harm

Code of Conduct

Offences leading to **mandatory** suspension or expulsion

OTHER SERIOUS OFFENSES THAT POSE A SERIOUS THREAT TO SCHOOL SAFETY, SUCH AS:

Serious Assault	Arson or attempted arson
Sexual Battery or attempted sexual battery	Homicide
Kidnapping or abduction	Armed robbery or attempted armed robbery
Battery on a Law Enforcement Officer, Firefighter, and Emergency Medical Care Provider	Battery on a school board employee, sports official, or other specified officials
Serious Battery	Bringing, possessing, using or selling explosive/destructive devices
Disruption on Campus-Major	Trespassing
