FAST testing will take place 3 times throughout the year, parents will be notified via Parent Link prior to each test date. Testing data/results will be available to parents on Virtual Counselor, in which they will receive a Parent Link with instructions on how to access. Parents will be invited to all monthly SAC meetings where they will be given the opportunity to provide input and receive information regarding the education and resources available to their students. Parent-teacher conferences will continue throughout the year as needed or requested. Parents will be notified in writing if they are being taught for 4 or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not labeled as highly qualified or 'out of area' for the subject they are teaching. Walter C. Young communicates via the marquee, school website, weekly Parent Links, social media outlets, like Instagram, Twitter, Facebook.

Accessibility
