IMPORTANT MANDATORY POLICIES

ID BADGES

Students must wear their school ID to gain entrance to our campus.

Student IDs must be worn to campus each day and students must keep them on throughout the day. Students must display them at all times while on campus.

Per the Code of Conduct,

- students shall wear their current, unaltered, and official school issued ID Badge, clearly visible on the front of their person.
- IDs are always worn while on school grounds and on school-sponsored transportation.
- If the badge is stolen, misplaced, or otherwise not accessible to the student while on the school campus, a replacement will be issued.
- Replacements will be issued up to three (3) times at no cost to the student.
- After 3 replacements have been issued during that school year, the student will incur a financial obligation of 5 dollars each.
- The financial obligation shall be handled in accordance with the district's policies, rules, and standard practice bulletins governing the collection of these funds.

Tardy Policy

Tardy Policy: Being on time to class is critical for optimal student learning! Students are released from the cafeteria in the morning at 7:25. Class starts at 7:30 and students are required to be in class, seated, and ready to learn by 7:30. Any student who is not in class at 7:30 must go through the auditorium and check in with the TARDY team to receive a TARDY pass to class.

First, Second, Third Tardy ~ Warning

4th, 5th Tardy ~ Complete critical thinking Tardy Assignment before allowed to go back to class

6th Tardy and beyond ~ Internal Suspension assigned for Study Hall period

Drop off/Pick Up Policy

First Day of School: Parents, please anticipate heavy traffic on the first day of school. It is important for you to arrive early.

West Bus Loop: School Bus Drop Off only

Front of School ~ East Parking Lot: Parent Drop Off & Staff/Visitor parking

Back of School ~ West Parking Lot: Faculty and Staff Parking

West Lot ~ Enter Gate on 8th Street: Student Parking


Pick up: The pick-up car line is in the front parking lot at the front of the school. Please follow directions given by employees directing traffic. There is only room for 1 lane of traffic coming in for student pick-up.


There is no early pick-up after 2:00 PM. All cars arriving for pick up after 2:00 will be asked to wait in line outside the gate and will come into the lot when the gate is opened at 2:30.

There are a number of important forms that need to be completed at the start of the school year.

This information is key for ensuring your child is safe while on campus, and that families are informed about all rules and expectations for the school year.

Key forms that need to be completed include:

- Emergency Contact and Release Forms
- Broward School Board Code of Conduct
- Photo/Media Release
- Updated Contact Information
- Medical Notifications and Medications



Welcome to the new school year. Parents/Guardians can now fill out your child's back-to-school forms, online. The forms are easy to complete and all data is protected and secure. For families with multiple children attending Broward County Public Schools, some information will only need to be entered once.

Use the Back to School Wizard below to quickly step through the process. You will need your student's identification number. Forms can be filled out in English, Spanish, Haitian-Creole and Portuguese.

You must complete these forms at the start of each school year for each student enrolled in the District. If you are not able to complete the online forms in one session, you can resume where you left off at another time. It is recommended that you set aside approximately 20 minutes for this process. Once you complete and submit the forms, you will receive an email confirmation. Print and return the confirmation to your child's school.

5. Press **Confirm** the district displayed is "Broward County Public Schools".
6. Create your password. Repeat your password. Press "Confirm Password" on the screen when complete.
7. If successful, you will be directed to the **Thank You** screen. At that time, please check your email inbox for an email from noreply@synovia.com.
8. Open this email and click the "Activate My Account" link. Once completed, close the browser. You may now open the app and sign in with your email address and newly created password.

Register by **June 28, 2024**, guarantees a bus seat by **First day of school**.

- Registration between June 29-July 12, 2024, bus seats will be assigned no later than the second week of school.
- Any registrations after July 12, 2024, will be routed expeditiously in the order in which they were received.
