Mission Statement

Our mission at Riverland Elementary World Languages Magnet School is to provide a teaching and learning environment that enhances self-esteem and enables students to reach their maximum social emotional and academic potential. Engagement of Parents and Families

Flexible Parent Meetings

Riverland Elementary World Languages Magnet School will offer a flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and may provide with funds under this part, transportation, childcare, or home visits, as such services relate to parental involvement [Section 1116(c)(2)].

Riverland Elementary World Languages Magnet School will schedule meetings to be held at various times during the school day or evenings to better accommodate our parents. Teachers will hold individual conferences with parents of children in their classrooms. Parents will be given a summary of the students' test scores and an explanation of the interventions and/or enrichment strategies that teachers are using to assist the child in reaching their achievement goals. Parents will be asked to engage in a discussion of how they can support these efforts. Parents will also be given suggestions for

coordinating school/parent efforts and explanations of homework and grading procedures. The school will offer parents a special workshop each year to provide an explanation on the statewide assessment systems, standards, promotion criteria, and other accountability measures. Also, the school will host several academic literacy and math trainings where childcare and academic resources will be provided.
