Flexible Parent Meetings

Parents will be asked to engage in discussion of how they can support these efforts and **how they feel we can best teach their child.** Parents will also be given suggestions for coordinating school-parent efforts and explanations of homework, classwork, and grading procedures. The school will offer parents a Curriculum Night each year to provide an explanation of the Florida States Assessment with Best, statewide and districtwide assessment systems, state standards, school curriculum, and strategies they can do at home to support the learning of the standards the students are doing in their classrooms.
