Mission Statement

Rock Island Elementary School is committed to providing students with a safe and stimulating environment, a love of learning and respect for our world through the combined efforts of faculty, staff, parents, and community. At the SAC meeting, parents will be provided information regarding the Title I Allocation and will be encouraged to provide input in the development and decision-making process of all Title I related activities designed to increase parent involvement. An annual survey will be conducted and completed by 75% of parents, and the results analyzed to evaluate the effectiveness of the Rock Island Elementary's Parent and Family Engagement Plan. Teacher parent conferences are to be held at a minimum two times throughout the school year to inform parents about content, material, and student data to help their children succeed.

Flexible Parent Meetings
