Please ensure that your child reads a book every night for at least 15-20 minutes and works daily for at least 10 minutes a day on their iReady personalized learning path. Do not exceed more than 50 minutes a week in Reading and Math.

You will be able to see their report card and interims on virtual counselor. The same process that the district used last year will be used again. If you are not sure how to sign into virtual counselor or are not able to remember how you can always contact your child's teacher or the school. Arrival and dismissal is going very smoothly, but we can always do better. Just a few reminders: If your child needs assistance getting out of the car or they are finishing up breakfast please park your car in our parking lot and help them get out. You can walk up to the many drop off areas and an adult from the school will make sure they get to their right location. When waiting for other parents to drop off their students is a good the time to get your child ready to leave the car. Pick up and drop off is only one line of cars. Do not pull around the line and have your child walk between cars to get picked up. This is a very dangerous practice.
