INTRODUCTIONS: (about 10-15 seconds)

A. Relate the introduction to ideas that are or might be discussed for debate.

1. Use a quotation; and/or
2. Use an analogy; and/or
3. Use statistics to raise awareness of a problem

B. State your team's purpose

C. Conclude introduction with stating which side the judge should vote on (the side you are on aff/pro or neg/con).

*Do not state your name and school.

Example: "My partner and I stand on the (side) of the resolve: (state the resolve).

CONCLUSIONS: (about 10-15 seconds)

A. State your team's primary contentions

B. Conclude with reminding the judge which side they should vote on (the side you are on aff/pro or neg/con).

*Similar to the introduction
