#### COMPREHENSIVE NEEDS ASSESSMENT

1. Describe the process utilized to conduct the comprehensive needs assessment for yourschool.

Nova Eisenhower used the FAST data from the 23-24 school year. We also looked at the number of students enrolled in Tier 2 and Tier 3 in order to address our student needs. Teachers used prior data along with beginning of the year assessments. Teachers analyzed their individual student data to address the specific needs of their students.

Parents are also an important part of the process. A parent survey is sent home each year to gather input concerning curriculum, environment, and communication. Results from this survey is used to help write goals and objectives for the school.

Parents are invited to meet with administration to discuss student achievement results and strategies for improving scores. Suggestions are discussed with staff and considered for inclusion in school-wide plans.

Describe strategies that will be used to attract high-quality, highly qualified teachers.

The district's Talent Acquisition and Operations Department along with district level Talent Recruitment Committee work collaboratively to recruit and retain Highly Qualified, certified-in Field educators. Candidates are interviewed at the recruitment fair and referred by the Instructional Staffing Department. Teachers are supported and mentored to grow professionally by veteran teachers in our New Educator, TIER program through district and in-school trainings. We also continually recognize our teachers with incentives for effective teaching practices and student gains.

Staff development funds are used to develop a comprehensive professional training program to improve delivery of instruction through a variety of workshops designed to move teachers to mastery and improve student acheivement.

Parent Engagement Funds are utilized to fund academic parent nights that provide parents with new skills to support student learning at home. Improving the frequency and quality of family participation and increasing family literacy are also goals of our parental engagement component. Title 1 funds are also used to purchase food, supplies/materials and to provide stipends for teacher presenters of our parent engagement activities.

They are also connected with community agencies to ensure that needed services such as health and nutrition are provided. Remediation and tutoring services are also provided as needed.

All students are being instructed by certified, ESOL endorsed teachers. Nova Eisenhower Elementary has a paraprofessional who works closely with our ELL population. This staff member impacts all of our ELL students each week delivering support and intervention programs. This staff member serves as liaison between the school and ELL community. Additional training and support are provided by the Bilingual/ESOL Department.

#### **Title IX- Homeless**

8. Homeless Students. Provide a description of service school level contact, identification process and services provided to these students.

Teachers and staff members are responsible for helping to identify homeless students and referring them to our school-based Guidance Counselor who then refers them to the district's Homeless Education Assistance Resource Team (H.E.A.R.T). The purpose of the homeless education program is to identify homeless students, remove barriers to their education including school enrollment, provide them with supplemental academic and counseling case management services as well as links to their school social worker while maintaining school as the student's stable environment.

#### 10. Violence Prevention

Nova Eisenhower Elementary implements the County Student Code of Conduct and follows the district's calendar of events that focus on violence prevention. We offer training for teachers on Anti-Bullying and host school-wide, week long, observances such as Start with Helio, Peace Week, and Anti-Bullying Week. We conduct quarterly kindness activities for grades K-5 such as our Mystery Guest Reader Program where grade level appropriate books are read to students to encourage kindness.

Nutritional programs and health education are an integral part of our school, specifically through the Physical Education curriculum and federal initiatives of the Broward County Public Schools Food and Nutrition Department.

Refrerrals are made to the school social worker when parents are in need of housing or food. Additionally, the front office staff takes note of families expressing a need and passes the information on to administration and/or the Guidance Counselor.

They are given a tour of the school to help parents become more comfortable with the new environment.  In May, the fifth grade students are taken to the middle school for an orientation. The students are able to familiarize themselves with their new school and receive information to help prepare them for a successful start to the next school year in the Fall.
