IV. Principal Updates

Principal's Welcome: Ms. Fatout (Mentor)

a. Take Your Child to Work Day

b. Budget Update

- Budget is determined by projected student enrollment, not actuals, and is subject to district adjustments.
- Fluctuations during the school year impact funding allocation.



Changing feeder patterns also influence budget decisions.

c. Title I Status

- The school previously met the 50% threshold for Title I funding.
- The district has increased the requirement to 60–62%, resulting in loss of funding.
- The school retains conditional Title I status for rest of year. (Or one more year)
- Special recognition was given for extensive efforts in outreach and compliance support.

VI. Positive Behavior Plan (2025–2026)

Presented.by.Mri.Kosis

a. Overview

- The Positive Behavior Plan is in draft form.
- It will be reviewed and voted on by staff on April 29, 2025.

Required to be uploaded to the SIP (School Improvement Plan) system up approval.

b. Referral Data Highlights

- 28% of students have at least one referral (district average is approx. 15%)
- 2% of students have five or more referrals
- Many referrals originate from incoming 6th-grade students without complete records
- Top 5 behavioral issues will be targeted for improvement

c. RTI Implementation

- RTI (Response to Intervention) is being implemented for better student support
- Focus on early identification of behavior needs and tailored interventions

d. Discipline Measures and Detention

- New measures include quicker assignment of detentions (e.g., same-week for infractions)
- Minor infractions tracked before consequences are assigned
- Goals include reducing disruptive behavior and improving school climate

e. iCHAMPS Program

- If classroom-based referrals exceed 40%, iCHAMPS will become mandatory
- Current classroom incident rate is 29%
- Participation in iCHAMPS remains voluntary for now

f. Goals

- Reduce overall classroom-based incidents by 40%
- Support student retention and academic success through structured behavioral support
