

## WHAT WE LEARN IN CLASS?

## Prekindergarten

In school this mornth we will be learning about the importance of staying healthy. We will learn about healthy foods and why exercise is good for us. We are counting groups that have up to ten objects. Try the following activity at home: together make a laist of ways your family stays healthy. As you make the list, have your child act our ways to stay healthy, such as brushing his or her teeth daily. Parents, please read to your children during the winter break. The preschool team wishes you a safe and happy holiday.



## Kindergarten

This month in kindergarten, we focus on the many story's writers tell and in math, we are learning to add number and subtract 1-digit numbers. In science, we are learning about how objects move (push or pull) and in social studies, we are focusing on American history. We are celebrating many different cultural holidays this month such as (Christmas, Hanukkah etc) and our teachers are teaching us about them. Can't wait to share more with you next month.

## Grade

Our 1st graders are flying high and making good progress! 1st graders just enjoyed their Thanksgiving break and are now ready to rock the month of December! We are getting ready to take our FAST Reading test on Dec 5 and our FAST Math Test on Dec12. In our Reading Benchmark series, we are learning about narrators and how each fiction story we read has their own narrator. We are reading a lot of fantastic fiction stories as we learn about this. We are also discovering how to describe the main story elements in a story. In math, we are learning about counting to 100, counting backwards from 100, counting by 2s and counting by 5s. In writing, we are learning about narrative writing. In Science we are learning all about magnifiers. In Social Studies we are learning about important figures in history and how they contributed to our society. Please continue to read for 20 minutes every night with your child, practice sight words, skills words and complete homework as this reflects what we are learning in class! We would like to end December with a pajama party and winter activities to take us into Winter Vacation! More details to come! Thank you for all of your help and support!

## Grade

We are nearing the end of the calendar year 2024 and Hello wonderful second grade families! there is still so much to do before we leave on Winter Break. In the area of Reading (English anguage Arts) we are in Unit 4 identifying plot structure and describing main story elements. retelling a literary text, identifying and explaining the theme, identifying different characters perspectives, and comparing and contrasting important details in two texts. In in area of Phonics, we are practicing r-controlled syllable patterns (ur and or). In Writing, we are working on narratives. In Math, we are in Topic 7. This section of our book has us solving problems ivolving addition and subtraction using a two-step process. In Science, we are studying Force nd Motion. And in Social Studies, we are learning about America's first inhabitants. Thank you for supporting your child's success by reading with your child daily and ensuring that their homework is complete.

ust some reminders, we also have some very important tests in December. Our STAR Reading test will be given on December 5 and our STAR Math will be on December 12. The second i-Ready Reading Diagnostic Assessment will be given on December 16-17 and the Math
Diagnostic Assessment will be on December 18-19. As with each test, please make sure that
your child gets a good night's sleep, eats a healthy breakfast and arrives to school on time and
ready to do their best. Thank you again for all of your support!

Happy December third grade families! This month in reading we are working on character perspectives. Make sure to have your child reading many fiction stories! In math, we are finishing up place value (ones, tens, hundreds, thousands). Write down numbers for them and ask them which number is in each place. Enjoy your winter

In Math, we are diving into division with partial quotients! Students practice interpreting remainders to help them understand and solve division problems in real-life situations. They also estimate answers to help them check if their answer i reasonable. Students are encouraged to check their division problem using the inverse operation, multiplication! In Science we are learning that cooking, burning, rusting, and decaying are properties of chemical change. In Reading, we have begun an exciting nonfiction unit on the government! In this unit, student are exploring how our government helps solve problems for its citizens while learning important reading skills. They'll work on identifying the central idea of a text, using text features like headings and captions to gather information, and understandir text structure to see how information is organized by the author Students continue to develop an understanding of how to write expository essays including interpreting information from various sources to use in their writing.

December is a busy month filled with learning, celebrations, and community events. Stay encouraged and engaged by participating in the various activities we have planned.

  Math: We are currently working on Topic 7 and preparing for PM2 FAST Math
  assessment. Students are developing an understanding of the coordinate plane.
- assessment. Students are not only developing an understanding of how to locate points given the ordered pair but also understanding how to find the ordered pair for a given point.

  Science: Students are working on the standards of SC.5.P.11.1 & SC.5.P.11.2 Electric Circuits. Students will be investigating and illustrating the fact that the flow of electricity requires a closed circuit (a complete loop.) Students will also be identifying

  Reading/Social Studies: Students are currently working on Unit 3, which focuses on

  "The Constitution: Then and Now" and American History. In this unit, they will learn to explain how relevant details support the central idea, analyze the author's perspective, and track the development of an argument. Additionally, they will identify claims,

  - Run around and play every day: Physical movement and exercise can improve sleep and reduce stress.

- Take a deep breath and enjoy the moment: Kids grow quickly! Remember to enjoy the special moments created during this time of year.

Stay calm and peaceful with your family by finding calming mindfulness practices, such as mindful coloring or taking three deep breaths. Meadowbrook students love taking a mindful moment!
