Let me congratulate you on completing the first full month of school. Presently, we are analyzing data from our diagnostic assessments to determine where our students are, which then enables us to plan a tailored path of instruction.

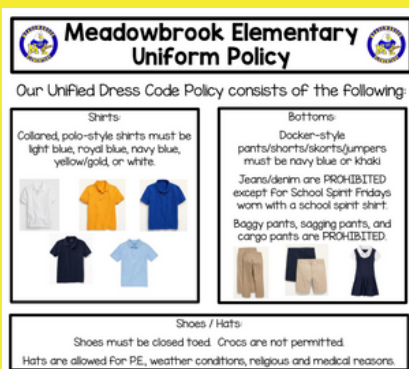
We need your help to accomplish our goals below:

- Increase English language arts (ELA) achievement to 44%.
- Increase 3rd Grade ELA achievement to 44%.
- Increase overall learning gains in ELA to 63%.
- Increase overall learning gains for students in the lowest quartile to 63%.
- Increase Math achievement to 51%.
- Increase overall learning gains in Math to 71%.
- Increase overall math learning gains for students in the lowest quartile to 63%.
- Increase 5th grade science achievement to 37%.

Students were issued quarter one progress reports at the end of September. I encourage you to schedule a Parent/Guardian Conference with your child's teacher soon to discuss beginning of year academic data. Help us reinforce learning by making sure students are practicing their skills by completing homework each night. Students should also be reading for at least 20 minutes each day at home.

I am fortunate to have an exceptional staff that is working beyond expectation, an amazing community of families, students, and partners who support Meadowbrook Elementary School. Thank you for your continued support.

## WHAT WE LEARN IN CLASS?

### Prekindergarten

The Preschool students are learning all about the weather. Our Letter person, "Ms. W," helps us check the weather every day. We are recording each day's weather on a calendar. We're also learning what to wear in a different kinds of weather. Please try the following activity at home. Each morning, look out the window and check the weather with your child. Encourage your child to choose what to wear for the day.



### Kindergarten

This month in kindergarten, our focus in reading is on identifying the main characters, setting, and important events in a story. In math, we are working on numbers 6-10. In science, we are exploring physical changes, and in social studies, we are learning about rules and laws. I can't wait to share more with you next month!

### 1st Grade

What a busy month it has been! We have been working hard in math learning our doubles, and how to use them to add doubles plus one and doubles plus two. We are also learning our facts for ten so that we can use them to make a ten to add and subtract. We use our cubes, our magnetic ten frames, and our white boards to help us. In science, we learned to classify objects by using different properties: texture, color, size, weight, and buoyancy. We explored buoyancy by testing many objects to see if they would float or sink in water. Then, we recorded our results! Now we are learning about force and motion by investigating different ways to move an object. Our reading skills are getting a workout as we learn new sight words, and practice blending, decoding, and spelling phonetically regular words. Our writing skills are improving, too, as we write descriptions, opinions, and information about many of the things we are studying. Thanks to all the parents who are helping us in our journey by reading with and to your children each night. Listening to them read to you has a major impact on their achievement. It's a privilege to share in these milestones with you!

### 2nd Grade

In second grade, we're focusing on developing new skills and strategies.

We've begun our first reading unit, where we're learning to create mental images, identify the central idea and key details, retell stories using main elements, and write expository essays. In math, we are currently working on Topic 3, which covers addition with sums up to 100. Students are exploring various strategies such as using a hundred chart, number lines, breaking apart numbers, compensation, and mental math. In science, we're wrapping up our unit on matter, where we've learned about the three states of matter and how to classify them. In social studies, we've covered maps and globes, and we'll soon introduce a new topic: Places Near and Far. We're excited to support your child's success this year, and we encourage you to help them read each night and complete their homework.

### 3rd Grade

Hello third grade families! It has been wonderful getting to know your students better! This month we are working on the ways characters shape stories. Try to read a lot of fiction books at home with your child! In math, we are continuing with multiplication. Be sure that flashcards are being used every single night at home! Now we will be diving farther into division, so it is very important for students to be memorizing multiplication facts. We are looking forward to seeing how much progress our pupils will make this month!

### 4th Grade

This month in ELA, students will begin Unit 2 in Benchmark. Students will be introduced to how events and characters affect the plot of a non-fiction story. In addition to this, students will also be introduced to the themes, finding the lesson or moral of the story. For writing, students will continue with non-text based expository essays and will eventually be moving into argumentative writing. In Math, we are finishing with patterns, factors, prime & composite numbers. Next, we move into multiplying larger numbers. (2 x 1 digit, 3 x 1 digit and 4 x 1 digit). In Science, students are learning about the different uses of water in each of its states (solid, liquid, and gas).

### 5th Grade

In September, we learned about the author's claim or perspective in any given text, explaining how relevant details support its central idea, understanding its text structure to further our understanding of the text, and writing expository texts on non-fiction topics. We will be taking our Benchmark Unit 1 assessment this week. We are looking forward to Unit 2 where we will be focusing on realistic fiction topics, character traits, and their different perspectives. We will delve into argumentative essay writing on realistic-fiction subject matters.

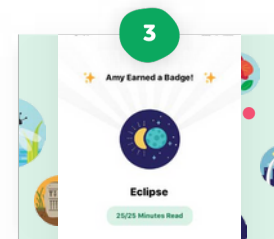
#### Sign In to your Beanstack Account

Select the 'Log Reading' button on the page and enter the title and author of the book read.

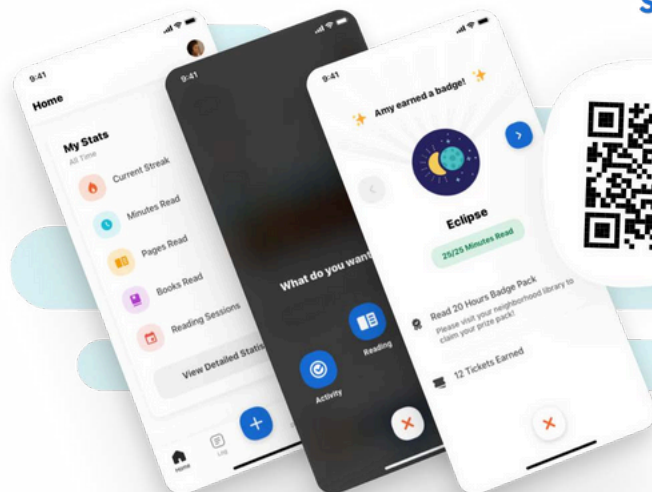

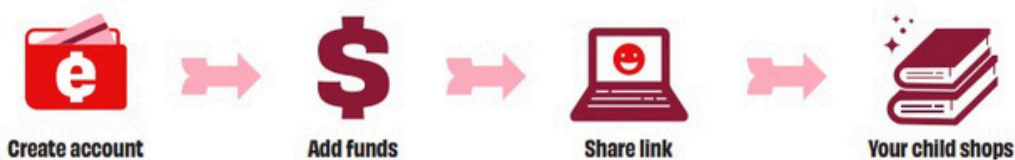

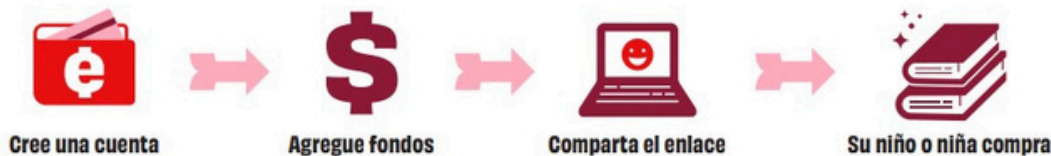
