PK The Specialized Preschool classroom will be busy in November learning letters O, C, E, Y, and Health and Nutrition (how to stay healthy through diet, exercise, and cleanliness). For math we will be learning the numbers from 1-10. We will have different craft activities for the month of November. Mrs. Secoy's Intensive classroom will be learning all about Thanksgiving and singing songs about turkeys. We will follow the Handwriting Without Tears Curriculum and learning the following letters G, S, J, and D. The November theme for Ms. Thompson's and Mrs. Khan's room is thankfulness. Students will work on letters B, K, and D.



KG We cannot believe November is already here! We are proud of all the Kindergarten students in how well they have adjusted to school procedures and routines especially for those who started eLearning at school. We know there was a shift in schedules, we appreciate all your understanding and support while we made some adjustments to get the perfect schedule. As we move into the 2nd Quarter, the students are learning so much more. We are continuing with letter recognition, letter sounds, rhyming, and sight words. We will be starting word families, and we will have deeper discussions at reading time that include the characters, setting, sequence of events, main idea, and details of stories. When reading with your child, it is good to stop and ask these questions as you read: "Who was in the story? Where did the story take place? What happened in the story?" This will help deepen their understanding of what they are reading. In Math, we are comparing numbers to 10. Practice asking your child to compare numbers as greater than, less than, and the same. We encourage the students to work on i-Ready at home. They should aim for 45 minutes weekly in reading and 45 minutes weekly in Math. We try to reach this goal during class time throughout the week, but any extra time at home is always great! Also, don't forget to log the books you read in Beanstack. 😊 Aim for 100 books by March to get a special award by the Media Specialist at the end of year Award ceremony. 1st Happy Fall! First grade students have been adjusting well to eLearning. As we move in to the 2nd Quarter, students should be able to navigate through Clever SSO, Canvas, iReady, STEMscopes, and Scholastic, as well as Studies Weekly and the other sites being used by each teacher. In Math, we will continue working on addition and addition strategies.

Please remember to:

- Encourage children to work independently when completing their assignments.
- Read daily with your child and log the books in Beanstack.

- Come back on time from recess and lunch.
- Go to Specials every day and be on time.
- For eLearning at home, please provide headphones and a quiet space for students to work.
- Work on iReady Reading and Math "My Path" assignments, at least 50 minutes of each per week.
- Check Canvas and have students complete all assignments as indicated by the teacher.
- Check the ClassDojo daily, both the messages and the class story. Parents should send a message to the teacher via ClassDojo if they have questions or need information.

We are looking forward to working with you to help your child succeed in first grade this year!



2nd Happy November! In the month of November. Second grade will be focusing on the following: In Social Studies, students explore the Immigration, Veterans Day, and Governments + Laws.

In Science, we will be introducing changes in properties of Matter and push + pull.

In Math, we will be focusing on place value to model, write and compare 3-digit numbers.

In Reading, we will be introducing Key Ideas and Details in Literature through asking and answering questions and recounting stories.

Parents remember to continue to visit iReady reading and math 45 minutes each subject every week. Also, visit Think Central for math assignments and Canvas course progress for each course to stay up to date with assignments. Thank you for your support.



3rd We are excited about beginning the 2nd Quarter of school! Just a gentle reminder that school starts at 8:00 AM. Our class calls begin promptly and your child may miss valuable information if they sign on late. During this month, we will continue to learn multiplication facts and strategies in math. Please work with your child to ensure that they know their multiplication facts up to 12. In Reading we are working on the concepts of sequencing a story and author's point of view. We will be focusing on learning test taking strategies. Please ensure that your child is reading daily. Asking your child questions about what they are reading, will help improve their reading comprehension. It would be helpful for you to look at your child's course progress in canvas, to see if there are any missing assignments. Please have your child complete any missing work as soon as possible. Thank you for your continued support!



4th Parents, 4th graders are working on the standards of RI.1.3 Technical and Scientific Texts, MAFS.OA.1.3 (solve multistep word problems using multiplication, division, + and -). Long division will begin next week. In Science, we will be learning about the Changes to the Land. In Social Studies, students are being exposed to studies of Early Florida. The Writing curriculum continues to be practiced daily and is an extension of the reading curriculum. We focus on the writing process in our lessons. iReady minutes for the week are still 45-50 minutes in each subject. It is the recommended amount for learning progress in the program. Please encourage your 4th grader to come prepared to each class meeting. Staying on camera is of utmost importance for teachers to gauge your child's engagement in the meetings. Finally, please remind your child not to leave the meeting without notifying the teacher. We do not want them to miss important parts of our lessons. Thank you for your support during e-learning. Ms. Kennedy, Ms. Linzer and Ms. Leon.



5th In Reading, students are reading their personal novels to practice the standard RI.1.3.

Mathematics instruction is focusing on division and the science topic is Energy. We are working on meeting the rigor in the standards. Please encourage your 5th grader to go back to their courses to locate the daily work and make sure they are completing those tasks. Daily work must be completed daily to stay up to date. Also, remind them to come into their class meetings prepared. Contact your child's teacher through Dojo or email for any support you may need. Thank you for your support during e-learning, Ms. Bagioti and Ms. Machado.



InD During November, the teachers will be delivering their classes via Microsoft Teams and providing academic instruction using Canvas. Next month in November our students will begin to learn about the "People Long Ago" and "Living in in Early America". Our InD class will read two stories and will be learning about the Past, Present, and Future. Our students will have the opportunity to engage in classroom discussions about the present and the past. We will also explore why people from the past moved from place to place.
