#### **Mission Statement**

### **Flexible Parent Meetings**

West Hollywood Elementary will offer a flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and may provide with funds under this part, transportation, childcare, or home visits, as such services relate to parental involvement [Section 1116(c)(2)].

West Hollywood Elementary School will schedule meetings at various times during the day/evening to better accommodate parents. The school will offer parents curriculum meetings for science, math, and technology as well. Furthermore, teachers will host success day to share the student achievements.
