Dear Silver Shores Family,

It is with the greatest optimistic enthusiasm that I welcome you to the 2019-2020 School Year. Let's get right to it:

SILVER SHORES ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IS AN "A" SCHOOL! From the center of my heart, I want to congratulate our faculty, staff, families, community, and most of all, our students, for an unprecedented year of student achievement. As Principal, I take no greater pride in watching our students succeed in their roles as both leaders and learners; taking responsibility for themselves, their learning, and our community. I believe there is no limit to what we can and will achieve at Silver Shores Elementary School. We will continue to be champions of student achievement, creativity, leadership, and family. We are committed to making every day important and better than the last. We will continue to learn from both our successes and our failures, strive for excellence, and shoot for the stars.

This letter will also serve as our first Community Newsletter, as there are some very important changes this school year that will need your immediate attention. Please read the remainder of this in its entirety.

First and foremost, in the aftermath of the February 14, 2018 Marjorie Stoneman Douglas High School tragedy, **safety and security procedures** have been continually updated, and new school board policies and state laws are now in effect. The following bulleted information will successfully navigate you through our safety and security protocols:

- NEW for 1920 We have hired a campus monitor, Ms. Lisariny Rivera. Ms. Rivera will provide us with an added layer of security by ensuring a safe and secure campus. Please welcome her to the Family 3
- All faculty and students will wear ID badges always while in school. To keep the student badges safe, your classroom teacher will hand out and collect them daily. If your child comes home with

- their badge, please ensure its safety and return it to school the following day. We will have one back-up ID per student. Thereafter, a charge may be imposed.
- All visitors, volunteers, school-board employees, etc. must enter the school through the main
  office and present proper ID for the STAR (Security Tracking and Response) machine. Once
  cleared, you will be given an ID badge and buzzed in to the main hallway. You <u>must</u> wear your ID
  badge <u>in a visible location</u> while in school. Parents with students participating the ESE PRE-K
  program or the InD K-5 classes will have further instructions from their teachers during the Meet
  and Greet and first three days of school.
- The main office door into the school's main hallway has an electric strike. The only way in is by buzzer, so please be patient while waiting your turn to enter.
- Silver Shores will allow parents to accompany their students to breakfast. Please arrive at 7:30am, as you will need to go through the STAR process before entering. Upon finishing breakfast, your child will go to class; you will drop off your ID badge in the front office before exiting school. Parents will not accompany their child to class after breakfast. Silver Shores will also allow birthday celebrations (see p. 9). Please review the procedures carefully.
- School Supervision <u>begins</u> at 7:30am. Please <u>do not</u> drop off students prior as there is no supervision. If you need to drop off early, we offer a Before-Care Program. Please speak with Ms. Franki Pasquale, Before and After Care Coordinator.
- As always, you will be allowed to walk with your student to class on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday of the first week. Please be reminded that this is NOT the time to engage teachers in conversation, as they will be supervising their classrooms prior to 8:00am. Please drop off your child at class, say goodbye, give them a hug and a kiss, tell them how much you love them and are proud of them, then exit the school and have a peaceful day. On Monday, August 19<sup>th</sup>, students will begin their independence by walking to class themselves. Parents will be stopped at the front doors.
- NEW for 19-20 ALL student drop off and pick up will be done in the front car loop (see pp. 7-8). There will no longer be drop off and pick on the side of the school where buses are. This was used specifically for our students with disabilities. However, with the construction of Pembroke Road, we will no longer utilize the side of the school. Access to the parent car loop is on Dykes Road, just south of Pembroke Road. For my parents with children with special needs, further instructions will be provided by your teacher at meet and greet, or you can speak with someone in the front office.
- Please pay very close attention to traffic patterns during drop-off and pick-up (see pp. 7-8). Students are to be dropped off in the <u>car lane closest to the building</u>; the other is a thru-lane, stopping to let off your child puts them in danger of being hit and you in danger by causing a potential collision. Students should exit the car from the door closest to the sidewalk, not from behind the driver. Please DO NOT drop off your child in the parking lot as cars are constantly in motion, and it is unsafe.
- For afternoon pick up of students, your options are to either pick your child up in the car loop as a car rider, or you may park your vehicle at Silver Shores park and walk to the school's front entrance to pick up your child. We will refer to these students as "walk-up walkers."

- In addition to the monthly fire drills, we will now be conducting monthly code-red (lockdown) drills. I will inform the community the day of the drills, so <u>please make sure that all phone</u> <u>numbers, email addresses, home addresses, and emergency contacts are up to date. The hardest part of our job can be the inability to reach a parent during a crisis.</u>
- Broward County Schools practice two (2) fire drills, one (1) tornado drill, and now one (1) Code Red Lockdown drill during the first two weeks of school. If all goes according to plan (weather permitting), these are the dates for the drills

o Fire Drill #1: Friday, August 16, 2019

o Fire Drill #2: Tuesday, August 20, 2019

o Tornado Drill: Thursday, August 22, 2019

o Code Red Lockdown Drill: Friday, August 23, 2019

Silver Shores has a Mandatory School Uniform policy (see pp. 9-10). Please have your child dressed in the appropriate school uniform as compliance will be monitored daily and consequences will result for students out of uniform (unless it is a "dress down" day). There is information in the front office regarding our uniform policy and In Unison, our school uniform supplier. Please visit the front office with any questions or clarifications needed – I would rather answer questions and provide up-to-date information then consequence students. In Unison, our school uniform provider, will be on campus Tuesday, August 13, 2019, 8:30am -11:30am.

Please understand that our commitment to safety and security is not only priority, it is state statute; and we will only be as strong as our own personal commitment to ensuring these are implemented with fidelity. This year is going to be extremely critical, and I am asking for your patience, understanding, and willingness to commit to keep Silver Shores Elementary as safe and secure as possible. When one feels unsafe, the focus for learning is lost.

NEW — FortifyFL is a Suspicious Activity Reporting APP that allows you to instantly relay information to appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials. Downloading the APP from your Cell provider's APP store allows instant access for one to provide a description of the threat, share pics and videos, and optionally submit their contact information. Once a report is made, FortifyFL automatically routes your tip report to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials. FortifyFL was created and funded by the 2018 Florida Legislature as part of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act. The application was named by students from Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School. The Office of Attorney General, Department of Education and Florida Department of Law Enforcement coordinated its development and roll-out — https://getfortifyfl.com

<u>NEW – SaferWatch</u> is a web and mobile based security system that was built to provide a higher level of safety for individuals and enhance security for organizations including schools, corporations, public venues, neighborhoods and communities. SaferWatch empowers users to report an incident as they see it happening or submit a tip at a later time. SaferWatch provides real-time two-way communication during emergency and non-emergency situations. Users, administrators, security personnel and law enforcement can now seamlessly communicate all on the same secure network. SaferWatch Alerts provide detailed safety instructions based on the incident and the ability for users to contribute information. SaferWatch is also key for organizations to provide duty of care to their employees and

Second, Silver Shores Elementary will receive **Title I** funding for the 2019-2020 school year. According to the U.S. Department of Education, the purpose of Title 1 funding, "is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments."

The basic principles of Title 1 state that schools with large concentrations of low-income students will receive supplemental funds to assist in meeting students' educational goals. Low-income students are determined by the number of students enrolled in the free and reduced lunch program. For an entire school to qualify for Title 1 funds, at least 52% of students must enroll in the free and reduced lunch program. For the 2018-2019 school year, Silver Shores Elementary School had 55% of students enrolled in the free and reduced lunch program. The additional federal funding by Title I enabled us to purchase today's paramount educational intervention resources, which played a major role in our huge increase in student achievement; host quality Hands-On Science nights; provide dinner to our families that participated in our Title I Sponsored events; and exponentially increase our student achievement results.

## **AM / PM CAR LOOP PROCEDURES**

This serves as a friendly reminder about our procedures for morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up in the main car loop. To be proactive and ensure that everyone knows the procedures and we create the safest environment possible, please adhere to the following:

#### AM DROP OFF:

- Please drive through the loop slowly as people are continually crossing the street from the parking lot to the school
- Please use the car lane closest to the school for drop off and pick up; the outer lane is a thrulane for the parking lot – stopping to let off your child puts them in danger of being hit and you by causing a potential collision. Students should exit the car from the door closest to the sidewalk, not from behind the driver
- Upon arrival, please pull to the end of the driveway, or up to the car in front of you
- PLEASE REFRAIN FROM USING YOUR CELL PHONE / TEXTING WHILE IN THE CAR LOOP
- DO NOT EXIT the car; your child should be the only one exiting
- Please do not drop off students in the parking lot
- Please refrain from conversations as this is the time to drop off only; if you have a concern, or need to assist your child with something (i.e. sign an agenda), please park in the lot – DO NOT remain in the car loop as this stops traffic. Please walk your child across the parking lot to school
   – do not let them walk alone.
- Do not weave in and out of the lanes unless directed to do so this will eventually end up in a collision
- After your child exits, please exit the car loop in a safe fashion and have an excellent day ©

#### PM PICK UP:

- Please drive through the loop slowly and have your name tag displayed to expedite your child's pickup
- Please use the car lane closest to the school for pick up
- Upon arrival, please pull to the end of the driveway, or up to the car in front of you
- PLEASE REFRAIN FROM USING YOUR CELL PHONE / TEXTING WHILE IN THE CAR LOOP
- DO NOT EXIT your car; we will assist your child if needed
- Please refrain from conversations as this is the time to pick up only; if you need to speak with the teacher, please park in the lot DO NOT remain in the car loop as this stops traffic
- After your child enters the car, please exit the car loop in a safe fashion and have an excellent day ©

If we follow the procedures set forth, Silver Shores Elementary will continue to remain a safe and secure school, especially during our drop off and pick up times. ## STUDENT DISMISSAL – HOW WE GET HOME

Parents have a few options regarding regular afternoon pick up (2:00pm on regular school days, and 12:00pm on early release days). You must let your child know how they are getting home as we have internal tags that assist us in ensuring your child goes home the correct way. If at any time during the school year you must alter your child's dismissal, please let the front office know ASAP, and we will inform the teacher of the change, and provide the student with the appropriate tag. The following are the different dismissal scenarios:

- Car Rider student is picked up in front of the school in the car. Parent remains in the car and drive through the car line. Parents will not exit their vehicle.
- **Bike Rider** student rides their bike to and from school. There is a bike rack in the front of the school that students will use.
- Walkers students will exit the school from the front door and walk home.
- Walk-up Walkers You may park your vehicle at Silver Shores park and walk to the school's front entrance to meet and pick up your child.
- **Bus Rider** students that are pre-approved to ride the Broward County School Buses. These students should have received a bus pass from the district.
- After-Care programs (Non-Silver Shores) students that attend other after-care programs may have private transportation, or they are met by adults and walk to their destination
- Private Transportation certain students have private transportation that parents pay for if
  they are unable to pick up their child on time. This scenario is not the responsibility of Silver
  Shores Elementary School. Please let your child's teacher know if you are utilizing a private
  service.

## **CAFETERIA PROCEDURES FOR BIRTHDAYS**

- Please provide proper ID for the STAR process. Once approved, you will be buzzed in, and are to report directly to the cafeteria. Please do not go to the student's classroom.
- This celebration is to provide a sweet treat for your child and his/her class. Please do not bring lunch food (i.e. pizza, Chick-Fil-A, etc...) to feed the class.
- Items given out to children <u>must</u> be store bought and brought to school unopened.
- Please provide either cupcakes, donuts, or cookies. Sheet cakes and ice cream are not permitted. Also, please provide plates and napkins for the students.
- Please refrain from bringing candles, balloons, games, and goodie bags.
- Students that are in your child's class are the only recipients of the birthday treat. Please <u>DO</u>
   <u>NOT</u> give out to other students in other classes.
- Privacy is highly protected, so please do not take pictures of other students, as it is a direct
  violation of the FERPA law (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act). Please visit

#### UNIFORM POLICY: MANDATORY UNIFIED DRESS CODE

**Tops:** Hunter green, white, navy or light blue polo-style with emblem. Students may also wear non-collared shirts with emblem and the Silver Shores spirit T-shirt.

**Bottom:** Navy or Khaki slacks, plaid, khaki, or navy shorts, skorts, or jumpers. Regular blue jeans on Fridays only. (No baggy or oversized jeans; no leggings).

**Shoes:** Athletic shoes are recommended, however. Students must follow School Board Policy regarding footwear. Students may not wear backless shoes.

**Belts:** Required for pants or shorts with belt loops.

As per school board policy no backless shoes, no hats, bandanas, or other head coverings, no sunglasses. Please see the student code of conduct for clarification.

#### On Cold Days:

Dress code must be adhered to everyday including cold days. Students may not wear sweatpants, jogging pants or another non-uniform pant. Uniform shirt still needs to be worn, sweatshirts and jackets need to be plain with no writing on them. During the cold weather season jeans may only on Fridays and must be accompanied by a uniform or spirit shirt. Long sleeve shirts may be worn under a short-sleeved uniform shirt. In addition, sweatshirts and jackets may be utilized but must be plain with no writing or pictures on them.

On cold mornings, school doors are opened at 7:15 am to allow students into the cafeteria.

Waivers for sincerely held religious beliefs only, may be requested the first 10 days of school.
