This is a friendly reminder that you are required to have a minimum of two conferences to stay informed about your child's progress. We have many fun and exciting events planned this month. On Tuesday, February 6, 2024, we will celebrate the 100th day of school. We have many 100 themed activities scheduled that day. On Thursday, February 15, 2024, we have a field trip planned for Flamingo Gardens. ASD Grade Corner

It is February! The month for love. Help your child build meaningful friendships! It is necessary for us all. As many as 52% of people with autism spectrum disorder report having few or no friendships. This can lead to lower engagement at school and less satisfaction with their lives overall. So... what can we do to help? There are a few things that can be done at home and at school to teach social skills and encourage the development of meaningful relationships.

1. Teach your child what a friend is.

While this may sound like a simple concept, people with autism often need to be taught social concepts directly. At school this may mean teaching lessons or having adults assist students when playing together. It can also include role playing activities and video modeling to help students see these situations from the outside.

2. Use social stories.

Schools and therapists often use social stories to teach expected behaviors and social cues. Premade stories are available online or you can easily write your own.

3. Help your child find others with shared interests. Making a friend is much easier when you have something in common. You can help your child find friends by enrolling them in a sport or a class that they enjoy.
