Dear Rocket Family,

The 2024-2025 school year is off to a great start. Open House is almost here. I hope to see everyone present on Wednesday, September 11th at 6:00 pm. Arrive on time, so that you can hear opening remarks from our staff and your scholar's teacher.

School begins at 7:55 am. The tardy bell rings at 8:00 am. Arrival to school on time is very important. In addition, scholars should be in school every day, all day. Early dismissal is highly discouraged. Scholars are to remain in school until 2:00 pm. Dismissals prior to that time, count towards truancy minutes. As an example, if you pick up your scholar at 1:00 pm for six days that will equate to missing one full day of school. Help us keep your scholar on track by scheduling doctor's visits after the school day.

At Rock Island, we take pride in our image and in the positive learning environment we offer. Scholars are expected to dress in a way that shows personal pride, and which acknowledges that school is a place to work and learn. There is a strong relationship between neat, appropriate attire and a positive learning environment. Students are to adhere to the unified dress code daily. All PK-2nd grade scholars are to wear navy blue polo tops and all 3rd-5th grade scholars are to wear red polo tops daily. All tops must have a collar. Scholars may wear a variety of bottoms in (i.e. shorts, skirts, pants, skorts, dress) however, scholars may only wear khaki. Scholars wear their uniform throughout the week.

Arrival and dismissal are always a top priority at the beginning of the school year. Preparation for this process begins well before the start of school. Here are some reminders to keep our scholars safe:

- 1. Arrival begins at 7:20 am. I made the adjustment to assist with the flow of traffic in the morning and to begin breakfast 10minutes earlier.
- 2. Scholars are to quickly exit out the right of your car at arrival.
- 3. Drive forward until the car in front of you stops. Please do not exit your car for any reason to keep you and our staff safe.
- 4. Dismissal begins at 1:50 pm. Car riders are dismissed directly to cars. Display your car tag hanger on your rear-view window facing forward, which helps alleviates you from having to stop your car to give the name of your scholar.
- 5. Once the last name is called at 2:15pm, parents that arrive after that time must park and come in to sign their scholar out.
- 6. Walkers are released at 2:00 pm at the northwest west gate. Parents are to notify their scholar's teacher if they are a walker. Parents are to remain outside of the walker gate for the safety our scholars.
- 7. A change of dismissal must be done prior to 1:00 pm. Dismissal changes require that you send an e-mail message to RIE_Changes@browardschools.com advising us of the change with the name of your scholar, their teacher, and your picture ID.

I look forward to seeing you for our Open House on Wednesday, September 11th at 6 pm.

Broward School Attendance Policy (policy 5.5)

All compulsory age students are required to attend school every day of the 180-day school year or the equivalent on an hourly basis pursuant to the state board of education. Parents of children of compulsory school age are responsible for their child's daily school attendance. Because poor academic performance is associated with nonattendance, schools will respond in a timely manner to prevent the development of patterns of non-attendance, which may indicate early signs of truancy. Schools will collaborate with appropriate local and state agencies that are involved in truancy prevention, intervention, and judicial action.

Additional information related to attendance can also be found in the current edition of the code of student conduct approved, as school board policy.




