- 4. Ask questions to help your child think instead of providing easy answers.
- 5. Praise your child when he/she solves a problem on their own.

Also please be aware that with the spring break quickly approaching students that are completing their final year of pre-k will be matriculating to elementary school. Please make yourself aware of the date and time that your child's school will be hosting kindergarten round-up. This will be an opportunity to meet the staff and tour the facilities of your child's school for the upcoming school year.
