The countdown is on! The **2022-23 FAFSA** form is coming on **October 1, 2021**. Completing the FAFSA form is the first step to obtaining federal student aid to pay for your higher education. Follow these eight simple steps to set you up for success and submit it on time.

Create a StudentAid.gov account (FSAID)

Student: An FSA ID is a username and password you need to sign the FAFSA form online. It takes about 10 minutes to create an FSA ID.

Parent: If your child is required to report parent information on the FAFSA form, you need to create your own FSA ID in order to sign your child's FAFSA form online.

- 2. Start the FAFSA form at fafsa.gov.studentaid.gov
- 3. Fill out the Student Demographics section
- 4. List the schools to which you want your FAFSA information sent
- 5. Answer the dependency status questions
- 6. Fill out the Parent Demographics section
- 7. Supply your financial information
- 8. Sign and submit your FAFSA form
