Math is off to a running start at Coconut Creek Elementary! Our teachers provide our students K-5 with a 60-minute core math block daily. The math instructional time is comprised of direct teacher instruction, collaborative learning experiences, and reteach/remediate small groups to assist students with timely, targeted support. We believe student learning in math is rooted in effective tier 1 instruction with a dependence on manipulative use which provides hands-on exploration of abstract ideas and creates an opportunity for kinesthetic engagement to build a concrete/tactile, fundamental basis for these concepts. Students utilize the Savvas Realize curriculum or "enVision" to ensure students are meeting the Florida B.E.S.T. standards for their grade level.

In the month of September, students are already finished with topic 1 and working through topic 2. Your student's topic 1 assessment was completed online, which will be true for all of their math assessments this year. Using the online testing platform throughout the year will help to equip students with the FL FAST testing system that is used 3 times a year throughout the state of Florida. Your student's individual teacher can communicate specific skills and mathematical concepts you can work on at home to support their current learning endeavors in the classroom. If you are unsure of what you can do at home to assist your student, please reach out to their teacher!

In addition, our school is also excited about using i-Ready Math again this year to provide supplemental, targeted student instruction. Students will complete their beginning of the year diagnostic in i-Ready on Wednesday, September 20th. This will provide an opportunity to know exactly where your child excels, and which areas could use some additional practice for mastery. From that point on, your student will have a customized pathway in which they can work to grow their math knowledge and build their capacity to fulfill grade-level expectations. Our ask is that students complete 30 to 49 minutes of i-Ready math a week with a 70% + pass rate to reach the largest gains and see the greatest increases in their understanding.

READING

Communication is key at Coconut Creek Elementary. As we continuously work on our literacy skills across all grade levels, we focus on communication through our reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills. So far this year, the students have been working on the foundations and routines of Benchmark Advance. This curriculum is aligned with the Science of Reading and incorporates the core components of reading. Students are exposed to literary, science, and social studies texts as they build their vocabulary and content knowledge. Within each unit, students are taught a myriad of ELA Florida B.E.S.T. standards. However, please be aware, these standards will spiral or be retaught throughout the year so mastery will most likely not be met the first time it is introduced. Your child will be engaging in whole group, small group, and independent learning. The first unit for all grade levels will focus on Life Science.

During this first month, students have engaged in the Florida FAST PM1 in both reading and math. On September 18, students will begin their first Reading iReady Diagnostic. Teachers and support staff will review and analyze the data gained from these assessments to help develop a plan that best meets the individual needs of each student.

Once the iReady Reading Diagnostic is complete, students will have their own instructional pathway which will help them learn the content. Our school expectation is that students complete 30 – 49 minutes of iReady Reading a week and complete at least 2 lessons with a 70% or greater pass rate.

Freedom Week


During the week of September 25th - September 29th, students will learn about the Declaration of Independence, the Bill of Rights, and America's Founding Fathers.

FOURTH GRADE

Hello there 4th grade family!!!!

We are excited to start a new school year with our students. It has been interesting getting to know them and we can't wait to continue building relationships with them as well as watch them grow academically.

Here are a few announcements, updates, and reminders:

Announcements:

All fourth graders have a daily folder that will go home every single day. Please look at them daily because important information will be sent home in that folder along with homework. Each student was given a planner (agenda) where they write down their homework daily.

We have a few field trips coming up for the students, so please be on the lookout!

Curriculum Updates:

The students took their FAST ELA and Math PM1 and the scores will be forthcoming. The students who haven't taken the FAST will complete it on designated makeup dates.

Math:

We wrapped up Topic 1 and started Topic 2. Topic 2 is focused on the basic facts of multiplication and division. Please review the basic facts with students. These basic facts will be the foundation for the upcoming topics in math. Students can practice using iReady Fluency Flight or xtramath. The students will be sent home with the login information for xtramath.

Reading:

In reading, we are still going over the Rules, Routines, and basic foundational skills. We will start Unit 1 of Reading in another two weeks. Unit 1 of Reading will be focused on Observing Nature. Our essential question that we will be focused on is How do we respond to nature?

Science:

The students started learning about the three different kinds of rocks in class and during our new Science Specials.

Social Studies:

In social studies, we are learning about reading maps to understand the world around us. We are focused on the state of Florida and identify specific features based on the type of maps the students are analyzing.

- Remember to have your car tag up during dismissal
- Open house is slowly approaching so please save the date: October 4th!

FIFITH GRADE




