SAFETY & HEALTH PROCEDURES

In preparation for this year, please know that the safety and security of our students will be our top priority at Dolphin Bay and across the district. Please read carefully as the following safety and security related non-negotiables will be implemented this year:

- All students/staff must wear their ID badges at all times.
- Students, staff and visitors must wear approved face coverings/face masks while on campus, except when eating or playing outdoors. We will follow procedures required by Broward County Public Schools.
- Students will sanitize their hands before entering the school building daily. Hand sanitizer stations will be available at the main entrance, the bus loop, and throughout the school.
- Students will wash and/or sanitize their hands frequently throughout the day. Soap and hand sanitizer will be readily available.
- Students, staff and visitors will follow physical distancing guidelines. We will follow procedures required by Broward County Public Schools.
- Miramar Police Department provides a School Resource Officer for our school. Additional security staff will be monitoring campus.
- Parents of Pre-K, Kindergarten and ASD Cluster students will be allowed to walk their children to the <u>door</u> of their classroom on the first day of school, Wednesday, August 18. Students should be in class by 7:50 am to begin their learning day as instruction begins at 8:00 am. On the first day, parents of students in 1st 5th grade will drive through the car loop and <u>remain in their car</u> to drop of their children for school. Staff will assist students in the hallways. Beginning on Thursday, August 19, ALL students will walk to class independently with the assistance of staff. All parents need to drive through the car loop and remain in their car.
- At dismissal time, students will be one of the following as determined by their parents: <u>Sunshine Aftercare</u>, <u>Private Bus</u>, <u>School Bus</u>, <u>Car Rider</u>, <u>or Walker/Bike Rider to Nautica or Walker/Bike Rider to Miramar Pkwy</u>. For car riders, parents will <u>remain in their cars</u> and drive through the car loop to pick up car riders. Parents will not be permitted to stand on the sidewalk in front of the school to wait for dismissal and/or pick up their children.
- Walkers/Bike Riders will be walked to the gates, where parents can wait, to pick up their child. Parents will not be permitted to enter the walker/bike rider gates during arrival or dismissal.
- All student car riders, <u>Pre-kinder through 5th grade</u>, will be dropped off and picked up at the main car loop on Miramar Pkwy. Parents will remain in their cars for morning drop off and afternoon pick up. <u>Pre-kinder parents will see Pre-kinder teachers for additional information for Pre-kinder dismissal procedures</u>.
- No students are permitted to be dropped off prior to 7:30 am.
- All parents/visitors/volunteers/guests are required to enter through the main office and present a valid driver's license, state issued identification card or passport. <u>Parents/visitors/volunteers/guests shall have their identification in hand, will be admitted from the front gate, will enter the office and will be signed in using the electronic visitor management screening system. Only one guest will be admitted to the office at a time. School visits should be pre-arranged except in the case of an emergency. <u>Individuals without valid identification are not permitted on campus.</u></u>
- We will be conducting monthly state-required safety drills.
- Students are required to wear uniforms Monday through Friday. On Fridays, students are permitted to wear PTA spirit shirts, which can be purchased through PTA with jeans or uniform bottoms. Students must abide to the Broward County Public Schools dress code detailed in the Code of Student Conduct. Uniform guidelines are khaki or black bottoms; white, gray, purple, teal, or black polo shirts or crew style shirts;. Uniform clothing can be purchased at <u>inunisonkids.com</u>

Prioritizing the safety, security and health of our students and staff is paramount. We appreciate your cooperation and ask that you communicate the importance of these procedures to your children

Volunteers must be <u>officially cleared by Broward</u> <u>County Public schools before volunteering</u> in school or chaperoning field trips. After you are officially cleared, <u>volunteering and chaperoning MUST</u> <u>be scheduled and preapproved by Dolphin Bay Elementary teachers/staff</u>. If you are considering volunteering or chaperoning, please complete an application as soon as possible.

Please note, the health and safety of our students and employees are the District's highest priorities. BCPS continues to work closely with federal and local health experts on COVID-19 protocols. Volunteers who are officially cleared by BCPS and scheduled to be on campus must follow school guidelines and procedures at all times.
