

Why the Change: Literature Review



The lengthened block of instruction also allows students to engage as more active learners, and the activities available increase retention of the material, so that less review time is necessary in subsequent classes (Schoenstein, 1994).




Kienholz, Segall, and Yellin (2003) commented that "block scheduling allowed students to learn material at a relaxed, less frenetic pace" (p. 64) and that "it enhanced the environment for learning for both teacher and students" (p. 65).



"In block scheduling, the focus is on 'depth of learning,' not surface learning and lowlevel recall. We design longer periods of time for students to engage in learning."
