SUBJECT: 2004-2005 TENTH DAY STUDENT MEMBERSHIP COUNTS

The total Pre-Kindergarten (Pre-K) through Grade 12 attendance reported on the first day of school, August 16, 2004, was 246,063 students. **The reported membership on the tenth day of school, August 27, 2004, climbed to 269,357 students**. Student membership includes all students who were in attendance at least one day and have not withdrawn at all schools including charter schools and centers. The data supplied is not yet disaggregated for standard education, Exceptional Student Education (ESE), and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) curricula.

Table 1 reports the first day student counts and tenth day student membership by level. As indicated in the table, total enrollment for 2004-05 increased by 23,294 (9%) students since the first day of school.

Table 2 depicts students in attendance on the first day of school for the last three consecutive years. First day enrollment increased by 1,160 students this year as compared to last year's increase of 5,355 students. Further, first day student enrollment increased at the high school, charter and center levels while decreasing at the pre-kindergarten, elementary and middle school levels.

Table 3 portrays student membership on the tenth day of school for the last three consecutive years. This year's tenth day membership increased by 1,364 students compared to the previous year's increase of 4,722 students. Tenth day student enrollment increased at the high school and charter levels while showing a decrease at the pre-kindergarten, elementary, middle and center levels.

On Monday, August 30, 2004, an updated Enrollment and Facility Planning Inventory (EFPI) will be released reflecting the 2004 tenth day enrollment. Included in the EFPI will be the preliminary FISH capacity reflecting the summer relocatable movement and the Florida DOE rule change. A preliminary list of critically overcrowded schools based on the tenth day, changes in FISH and criteria changes in Policy 5000 will also be released on Monday.
