
2008-09 TWENTIETH DAY ENROLLMENT REPORT BREAKDOWN

This memorandum provides the official school District enrollment to be used for statistical purposes. Recall that this data was secured on September 18, 2008, the twentieth day membership count. As can be seen in Appendices A through F, the total membership for this year on the twentieth day was 255,738 representing pre-kindergarten through grade 12 students enrolled in the District's 286 schools (138 elementary, 43 middle, 33 high schools, 16 centers and 56 charter schools).

As shown in Table 1, District enrollment dropped 3,167 students from 2007-08 marking the fourth consecutive year Broward County Public Schools experienced a decrease in student enrollment. In Appendix A, the District's elementary schools have 108,365 students (4,002 in pre-kindergarten and 104,363 in kindergarten through grade five). Middle schools (grades six through eight) have 53,843 students enrolled while grades nine through 12 have 70,240 students. The District has 4,592 students in its centers, while 18,698 students attend charter schools.

The count reflects decreases in pre-kindergarten, elementary, high school and education centers enrollment and increases in middle school and charter school enrollment when compared to the 2007-08 report. Overall, pre-kindergarten enrollment dropped by 40 students, while elementary totals (K-5 only) fell by 3,014 students, high school counts decreased by 1,138 and centers fell by 651. Middle school enrollment increased by 100 students and charter school enrollment increased by 1,576 students over last year's figures.

The District is divided into four geographic administrative areas. When analyzing enrollment patterns by area for the 2008-09 year, Table 2 below demonstrates the numbers of pre-kindergarten through grade 12 students vary among areas. North Central has the lowest student enrollment of 38,848. The remaining three areas serve between approximately 58,000 and 72,000 students: North, 66,606; South Central, 58,231; and South, 72,088.

As shown in Table 3 below, the South Area continues to enroll the largest number of students at 72,088. The South Central Area evidenced the largest decrease from last year to this September, decreasing by 2,186 students. As of 2008-09, the North Central Area no longer includes charter school enrollment. Comparing 2007-08 North Central Area student enrollment without charter school enrollment (39,839) shows a decrease in enrollment this year by 991 students. The North and South Areas experienced decreases of 889 and 903 students respectively.

As is noted in Appendix E, the North Central Administrative Area supports 13 center school programs that serve 2,813 students, the highest number of students enrolled in center schools when compared to the other three areas (North, 358; South Central, 116; and South, 445). Within the District there are five centers with programs that serve pre-kindergarten students in addition to those enrolled in kindergarten through grade 12. The pre-kindergarten enrollment includes: Hallandale Adult, 54; Dave Thomas Education Center, 180; Seagull Center, 93; The Quest Center, 72; and Whispering Pines, 11 for a total of 410 pre-kindergarten students.

Table 4 illustrates diversity breakdown Districtwide for the last two school years. Appendix E provides breakdown by school, center, and charter schools.

As shown in Table 4 and as listed by school in Appendix D, the percentage of males and females remained relatively constant over the last two years. Black students comprise the highest number and proportion of students in Broward, 96,690 (37.8%), decreasing by 441 students compared to last year. White students comprise the second highest number and proportion of students in Broward, 75,536 (29.5%), decreasing by 3,144 students compared to last year. Hispanic, Native American, and Multiracial student populations also decreased as compared to last year, while Asian student populations increased by 140. English Language Learners (ELL)

experienced an increase of 495 students as did Exceptional Student Education (ESE) by 386 students. Students participating in Free or Reduced Lunch (FRL) increased by 9,392 students.

Appendix E provides school enrollment disaggregated by grade levels of pre-kindergarten through grade 12. In addition, enrollment compared to 2008-09 projections is provided as well as permanent capacity. The actual 2008-09 twentieth day enrollment count of 255,738 students was within 99.1% of the projected enrollment (258,032). The twentieth day count as compared with permanent capacity reveals approximately 25,000 empty student seats in Broward County Public Schools.
