SUBJECT: 2008-2009 TENTH DAY STUDENT MEMBERSHIP COUNTS

The tenth day student enrollment was reported at 256,112 256,513 on Thursday, September 4, 2008. This number represents a decrease of 1,906 1,505 as compared to last year's ten day count of 258,018. This student enrollment count includes all students who were in attendance at all schools, including charter schools, centers, and other non-Full Time Equivalent (FTE) student sites. The Broward County Public School (BCPS) Pre-Kindergarten (PreK) through Grade 12 projected student enrollment this year is anticipated to be 258,032. This projected enrollment number is based on the twentieth day count, also described as the twentieth day of school.

This year's first day enrollment count was 231,208. This year's tenth day enrollment count was 256,112 256,513. Table 1 reports the increase between the first day and tenth day student enrollment by level. BCPS student enrollment includes all students who were in attendance at least one day and have not withdrawn at all schools including charter schools, centers and other non-Full Time Equivalent (FTE) student programs.

As the District moves towards the twentieth day enrollment count, staff monitors the enrollment increases based on the 2008-2009 projected twentieth day enrollment count as described in paragraph 1. Table 2 shows the percentage difference for the first and tenth day enrollment compared to the twentieth day enrollment for the last five years. This year an enrollment of

99.3% 99.4% students on the tenth day of school is closely aligned with the twentieth day enrollment trend of the last five years.
