**SUBJECT: 2009-2010 TENTH DAY STUDENT MEMBERSHIP COUNTS**

The tenth day student enrollment was reported at 254,849 on Friday, September 4, 2009. This tenth day count represents an increase of 23,354 students as compared to this year's first day enrollment count and a decrease of 1,664 as compared to last year's tenth day enrollment count of 256,513. This student enrollment count includes all students who were in attendance at all schools, including charter schools, centers, and other non-Full Time Equivalent (FTE) student sites. The Broward County Public School (BCPS) enrollment has already exceeded the anticipated twentieth day enrollment projected to be 252,544.

This year's first day enrollment count was 231,495. This year's tenth day enrollment count was 254,849. Table 1 reports the increase between the first day and tenth day student enrollment by level. BCPS student enrollment includes all students at all schools including charter schools, centers and other non-Full Time Equivalent (FTE) student programs who were in attendance at least one day and have not withdrawn.

As the District moves towards the twentieth day enrollment count, staff monitors the enrollment increases based on the 2009-2010 projected twentieth day enrollment count as described in paragraph 1. Table 2 shows the percentage difference for the first and tenth day enrollment compared to the twentieth day enrollment for the last five years. This year an enrollment of 100.9% students on the tenth day of school is closely aligned with the twentieth day enrollment trend of the last five years.
