



- Participation rates fell sharply in 2020-21, from 86% of 10th graders in 2019-20 to 46% in 2020-21, due to the Coronavirus pandemic.
- The racial gaps in participation between White and Black and White and Hispanic students grew in 2020-21, leading to an 11-pt. participation gap between White and Black 10th graders and an 8-pt. gap between White and Hispanic 10th graders.
- Broward scores for both 10th and 11th grade students outpaced Florida-wide scores for both Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (EBRW) and Math) but fell below national scores.
- Scores were up in 2020-21 for all three groups: Broward, Florida, and the Nation.
- Females outperformed males in EBRW and males outperformed females in Math.
- White students outperformed both Black students and Hispanic students in both EBRW and Math.
- Of those 5,992 students who participated in PSAT/NMSQT in 2020-21 and who had not yet met the Algebra I graduation requirement, 1,968 students (32.8%) met the requirement on one of the PSAT school days in 2020-21.

- College-Ready benchmark scores are scores set by the College Board that indicate readiness to begin college coursework in specific subject areas after finishing high school. The College Board benchmark for EBRW NMSQT 10th grade is 430, for EBRW 11th grade is 460; for Math NMSQT 10th grade is 480; for Math 11th grade is 510.
